

#### Linking Workers and Health Professionals

 PROSSTRAB, (Promotion of Workers' Health and Safety) was created in 2003 as a unique intersectoral partnership to improve worker and community health.



#### Linking Workers and Health Professionals

#### PROSSTRAB brings together:

- A University Research Center and
- A Union Confederation

To work toward prevention and treatment of occupational health problems in Nicaragua

- Union Confederation of Workers "José Benito Escobar" (CST-JBE)
- An alliance of 14 union federations representing workers across western Nicaragua.






- Center for Research in Worker and Environmental Health (CISTA)
- Located in the Faculty of Medical Sciences at the National Autonomous University of Nicaragua at León (UNAN-León)

 Global Health through **Education, Training and** Service (GHETS), a USbased non-profit, was instrumental in founding PROSSTRAB and continues to provide technical and financial support.

- PROSSTRAB's model emphasizes exchange between partners
- Workers learn from medical researchers and health care professionals
- Healthcare professionals and researchers learn from workers



# **PROSSTRAB** Activities

Together, the PROSSTRAB partners are working to:

- Train workers and healthcare providers on occupational health prevention.
- Improve the quality of and access to healthcare for workers
- Educate the Nicaraguan public about the health and safety risks workers face,
- Establish alliances with government agencies and community groups,

# The Nicaraguan Context

- Nicaragua faces a precarious economic situation.
- Nicaragua's participation in the Heavily Indebted Poor Countries Initiative (HIPC) of the World Bank trades debt relief for a development plan emphasizing accelerated industrialization and the opening of the economy to the international market.
- We are competing in a global market with cheap labor and a limited capacity to monitor and control the conditions of production.

# Risks faced by Workers

- Chemical agents like pesticides in agriculture
- Carcinogenic substances
- Physical agents like noise, extreme temperatures and dust
- Ergonomic risks

# Regulations and enforcement

- The Nicaraguan government has enacted occupational health regulations
- •But does not have adequate resources to enforce those laws.

#### Access to treatment

- Workers have little access to health care services
- Informal sector workers have limited access to health care
- Providers are not trained in occupational health.

# Training



 We have trained 300 workers and labor leaders in multi-day trainings on occupational health and safety

# **Training**

- Union and University members jointly develop and implement training
- Trainees are drawn from the member unions of CST-JBE
- By training union leaders,
  PROSSTRAB helps build commitment to health across the board in labor organizations.

### **Training**

 PROSSTRAB also works with the Ministry of Health, and has provided healthcare worker safety training to 40 employees of hospitals and primary care clinics run by the Ministry.



# Train-the-Trainer Model

 PROSSTRAB-trained workers, together with CST-JBE personnel, in turn provided basic training to 650 workers and management personnel



in the maquila, plastic, metal, construction, food and hotel, and service and retail sectors.

# Train-the-Trainer Model



- Trainers focus on their own workplaces, working with the "Mixed commission" there.
- Mixed Commissions are government-mandated committees formed of managers and employees that address occupational health issues.
- By training workers, PROSSTRAB helps ensure that Mixed Commissions are active, effective, and workercentered.

 At Productos Metalicos, S.A., PROSSTRAB training has resulted in an increase in the use of hearing protection among the 126 workers, and a reduction of trip and fall hazards, as well as a generally increased emphasis on work safety.



 Workers and management at the textile maquila Guanica, S.A. report improvements in safety and hygiene for approximately 1600 workers



including ergonomic improvements, protective equipment, and fire prevention and response systems.

- Health and Safety is cited as an important issue by maquila workers
- Concerns about health have been key to their successful efforts at unionization



 Ninety-two workers at a brick factory, Ladrillo San Pablo, were provided with protective equipment including gloves, masks, and boots following efforts by PROSSTRAB-trained leaders.



#### **Medical Services**

UNAN-León houses the only specialty occupational health clinic in Nicaragua, which offers integrated healthcare to workers, including medical and occupational risk evaluations that identify and address workplace-related illness and injury



#### **Medical Services**

 PROSSTRAB also provides some workplace health screening and risk evaluation services to maquila and steel industry workers.



# **Medical Training**

 CISTA faculty members have offered a course in occupational health at UNAN-Leon

 Students conduct research at local workplaces,



learning about occupational health through talking with workers and researching risks.

# Medical Training

- We are also offering a certificate program in occupational health to practicing medical doctors
- This will address the scarcity of professionals trained in occupational health and increase the pool of health care providers available to CST-JBE members
- We hope to locate a clinic at CST-JBE offices, linked trained MDs with union members

# Advocacy



PROSSTRAB's Occupational Safety and Hygiene (OSH) Council is a 30member advocacy and monitoring group concerned with the health and safety of workers affiliated with **CST-JBE** 

# Advocacy

#### Council members

- Represent various industries
- Are active in promoting occupational health at their own workplaces
- Meet monthly to develop responses to workplace health issues, deepen understanding of legal and medical issues, develop strategies for advocacy.

# Advocacy

- PROSSTRAB members also participate in the National Labor Hygiene and Safety Council, a federal body convened for input and discussion of occupational health policies
- Bring a pro-worker, informed perspective to these meetings.

 PROSSTRAB's work in linking sectors and emphasizing intersectoral collaboration was exemplified in our 2007 National Student-Worker Occupational Health Forum



 The first of its kind in Nicaragua, the forum was attended by 105 workers, employers, and unionists from a variety of economic sectors, as well as students and government representatives.

- Medical students and researchers shared their research and experiences, and exchanged input on each others' work.
- In addition, a representative from the Ministry of Labor presented on the future of occupational health policy in the nation.



- The forum generated much excitement among both workers and students.
- As a result of the forum, workers from two textile maquilas requested that PROSSTRAB facilitate five research projects in their workplaces.
- Government representatives reported that attending the forum deepened their commitment to occupational health

# Benefits of Intersectoral Collaboration

Collaboration between workers and health professionals has allowed PROSSTRAB to

- develop effective training
- reach a maximum number of workers through a train-thetrainer model that incorporates existing union and workplace structures
- provide needed services to workers
- advocate for improved policies on the workplace and national levels
