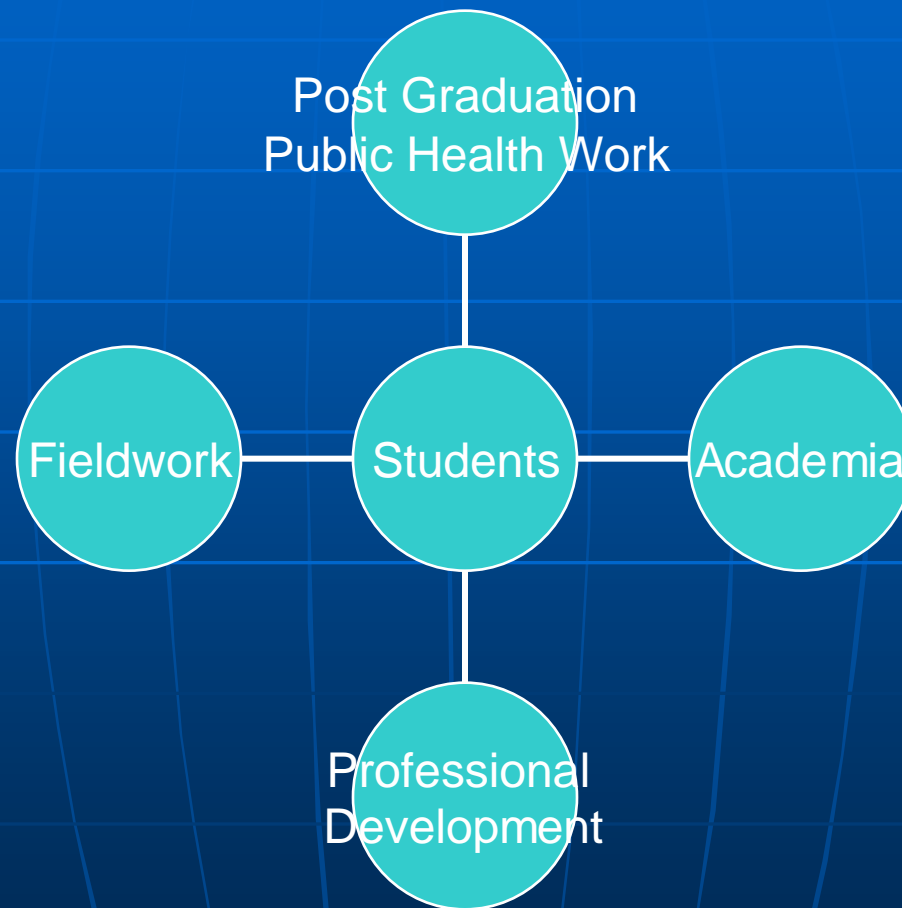

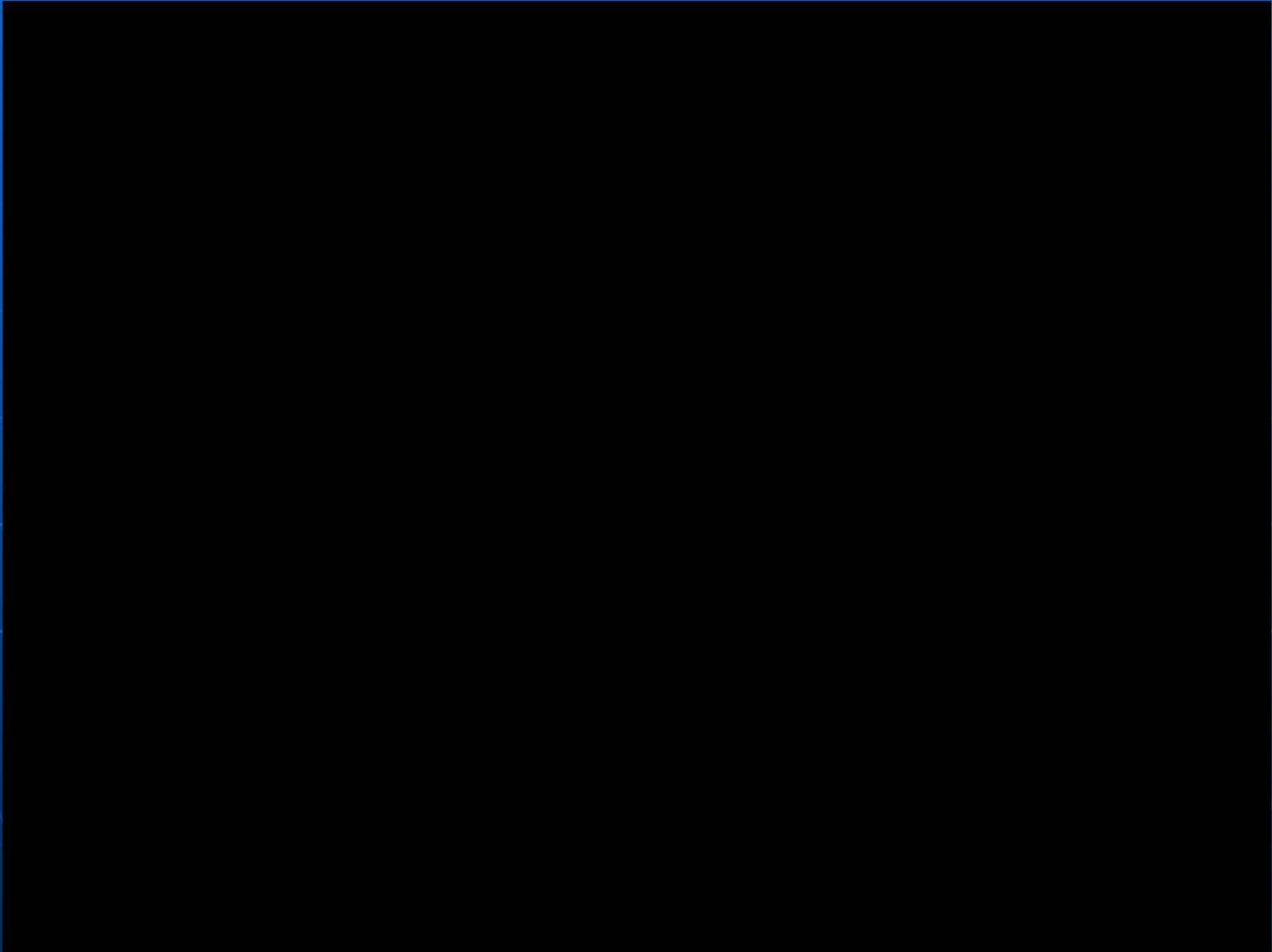
- To present an argument for mentoring as an essential component to initiatives addressing health disparities
