Key partners:

- U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA)
 - Three year HRSA grant
- Florida Legislature
 - Florida Statute 381.04015
- Committed individuals
 - Building relationships, creating momentum, and building sustainability





Comprehensive Women's Health Services Three Year Grant

- Awarded September 2004
- Three Year Funding Cycle \$300,000
- Goals to improve women's health through:
 - Increase awareness and improved coordination
 - Develop a forum for sharing information among other state agencies
 - Strengthen relationships with stakeholders in the private sector
 - Provide educational opportunities to increase public awareness





Florida Legislation

In 2004, section 381.04015 was passed creating:

- An Officer of Women's Health Strategy
- Establishment of an Interagency Committee on Women's Health

Mandates

- Collection and review of health data and trends
- > Organize women's health month activities
- Promote employer incentives for wellness programs
- Promote public awareness campaigns and education

Leadership

Officer of Women's Health Strategy

Ensure the state's policies and programs are responsive to sex and gender differences and to women's health needs across the lifespan.

Dedicated staff

- Women's Health Coordinator
- Special Projects Coordinator
- >Administrative Assistant/Web Manager

Intra-agency Committee for Women's Health

- Representatives from all state-level public health programs
- Committee developed:
 - The first inventory of DOH women's health programs
 - A gap analysis of core women's health services
 - Strategic plan to integrate women's health

Data Assessment



- Women's Health Data Report 2006
 - First comprehensive assessment of women's health status in Florida
 - Analyses of morbidity and mortality data, behavioral factors, indicators of access, reproductive health and unique health issues.
 - Functions of report
 - Captures attention of policy makers
 - Provides an assessment template for benchmarking progress
 - Collaborative effort

Maximizing Resources

Let others do it for you!



- SWOT (Strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats) Analysis

Working to Improve Women's Health in Florida May 15-16, 2007, Tampa Convention Center

An educational forum for women's health stakeholders to discuss major issues affecting women across the lifespan.

Maximizing Resources

Governor's Conference for Women's Health
Convened in 2006 (Orlando, FL) and 2007 (Tampa, FL)
Mandated without funding
2006 – University of South Florida cosponsored first conference
Partnerships with Intra-agency and Interagency Committee for Women's Health

≥2007 – 19 organizational co-sponsors





Conference At-A-Glance

- 310 participants from across the United States and Puerto Rico
- 26 Break-out Sessions
- 50 participants at the Town Hall Meeting
- Over 1,000 hours worth of continuing education credits awarded
- 42 Exhibitors and Vendors present
- Over \$20,000 collected in sponsorships
