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

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Social Determinants of Health in BVHP

- 1. Lack of employment and economic development;
- 2. Poor housing conditions; legacy of environmental health problems;
- 3. Few nutritious food outlets;
- 4. Freedom of motion impaired by violence in the community;
- 5. Low rate of vehicle ownership;
- 6. No hospital services; large number of uninsured adults.

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BVHP Health Disparities Compared to Other SF Districts

• Higher prevalence of asthma

 Higher rates of hospitalizations for four chronic diseases (asthma, COPD, diabetes, congestive heart failure)

 Higher rates of premature death; violence is the leading cause of premature mortality in BVHP



Built Environment Determinants of Health Care Access

 Deficit of health care services and hospitals relative to population's health status

 Public transit routes not designed for health care destinations

 Current transportation assistance programs do not meet the need



Opportunity: Regional Agency RFP for Lifeline Transportation Funding

Local County Transportation Agency awards BVHPF proposal \$924,879 over 3 yrs:

- 3-year BVHP community shuttle
- Last 2-years reimbursement of hospitals' taxi vouchers for chronic disease maintenance visits and support services

Proposed Shuttle Route



Proposed Shuttle Schedule

- Pick up patients at lowincome housing developments, senior centers, social gathering spots
- Deliver patients to health care settings
- Three trips/day to County hospital, 2.6 miles from BVHP commercial corridor
- 10.5 hours continuous service
