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## Systems of Care

- Are comprehensive spectrums of mental health & other services organized into a coordinated network to meet the multiple & changing needs of children & youth with severe emotional disturbance & their families.
- Since inception, CMHS has provided over \$1.16 billion to 126 grantees in 50 states, 2 territories & the District of Columbia.

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# Why Would There Be Conflict?

- Changing relationships among organizations & with families
- Developing & implementing a shared vision
- Ensuring transparency in communication
- Managing new resources

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### Purpose

- The purpose of this project is to learn about the sources of conflict and conflict resolution in SOC
- Based on what we learn, we plan to develop a mediation approach to conflict resolution

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### Response Rates

 A total of 218 individual responses from 44 of the 86 sites.

This is a 51% response rate.

26 sites have 4 or more responses.



(N=218)






#### Prevalence of Conflict by Source (N=213)






# Behaviors Sites Engaged in when Conflict was Present






#### Techniques Used to Resolve Conflict






# Assessment of Governing Board by Respondents






# System of Care Effectiveness by Respondents





Would the availability of staff trained in conflict resolution skills have help?






## Concept Mapping
