

Public Health Nursing Competencies

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Public Health Nursing Competencies represent a set of skills, knowledge and attitudes necessary for the broad practice of public health.



The 8 domains:

- 1. Analytic Assessment Skills
- 2. Policy Development/Program Planning
- Communication Skills
- 4. Cultural Competency Skills
- 5. Community Dimensions of Practice Skills
- 6. Basic Public Health Sciences Skills
- 7. Financial Planning and Management Skills
- 8. Leadership and Systems Thinking Skills

For each domain there are a list of actions that describe the attributes and skills needed to achieve competency.

Domain # 1: Analytic Assessment Skills

- 1. Defines a problem
- 2. Determines appropriate uses and limitations of both quantitative and qualitative data.
- 3. Selects and defines variables relevant to defined public health problems.

Mastery of each level progresses from

awareness . . .

to knowledge . . .

to proficiency...

which is on a continuum.

- Orientation tool selected for model
- Identified for Jefferson County Management Excellence Program Project













Pilot Process

- Existing orientation tools reviewed for content
- 2. Ideas shared from other county competency project



3. Language adapted for PHN competencies





Pilot Process (continued)

- Three month initial trial with new and experienced PHNs
- 5. Used quarterly evaluation meeting time
- Supervisor group met monthly to review findings and make revisions
- 7. Pilot progressed for one year with new PHNs

Definitions:

- Awareness: Basic level of mastery of the competency. Individuals may be able to identify the compet or shill but have limited.
 Knowledge: Intermediate level of mastery of the competency. Individuals are able to apply and describe the shill.
- Proficiency: Advanced level of mastery of the competency. Individuals are able to synthesize, critique or teach the skill.

Domain #1:

Analytic Assessment Skills

CDC

- a. Identifies reportable disease characteristics including confirmation of diagnosis, transmission modes and methods of control.
- b. Screens for recommended schedule of pediatric immunizations

MCH

- a. Obtains infant weight, length, head circumference (HC)/Growth & Development (G&D)
- b. Performs newborn,
 postpartum, Antepartum,
 Prenatal+, Expedited
 Permanency Planning,
 Breastfeeding, Partners
 For Healthy Families
 program assessments

Clinic

- a. Assesses for appropriate contraceptive choices and methods
- b. Effectively interprets lab data



Domain #8:

Leadership and Systems Thinking Skills



- a. Role models ethical and values standards within the organization
- b. Participates in strategic planning to improve services

MCH

- a. Participates in leadership activities, e.g. report, case conference, team minutes, and agenda
- b. Precepts nursing students and/or takes students on home visits



- a. Participates in leadership activities, e.g. report, case conference, team minutes, and agenda
- b. Precepts and mentors students in providing clinics and services



Empirical Findings and Recommendations

What worked best . . . Most Effective Use of Tool

- Self-scoring for introspection
- Review during quarterly evaluation meetings
- Goal setting guide
- Quad Council document defines ratings, clarifies terminology



Comments from Pilot

PHN Staff:

"Tool requires critical thinking, introspection, and reprioritization."

"This is a road map for where I want my career to go."

"This is dynamic and flexible and there is always room for improvement."

"This is a conversation between you and your supervisor."

Supervisory Staff:

"Tool demonstrates unique level of critical thinking, skill and impact that PHN practice requires."

Next Steps

- Encourage use of model for public health professionals to evaluate their level of competency and identify/take opportunities for growth
- Apply to job descriptions, interview questions, and evaluation materials
- Share work and experiences with PHN groups in other counties and states
