

Reasons for declining attendance

■ Loss of interest in activities – 62%

■ Events get "out of control" — 54%

■ Too crowded – 44%

■ Just not fun anymore – 39%

What students want

Nearly 1/3 of Students are calling for new and safer activities like games to be added to Spring Weekend– (29%)

 Over half of the students want more non-alcohol related events – (56%)
