Background

- The lesbian or female homosexual population has been defined by the Institute of Medicine (IOM) as women who have sex or primary emotional partnerships with women.
- One IOM priority is to better understand how to define sexual orientation by sexual identity, behavior, attraction or desire, or some combination of these.
- An IOM recommendation is to add sexual orientation items to largescale probability surveys to determine the range of expression of sexual orientation among all women and the prevalence of various risk and protective factors for health by sexual orientation.
- Sexual orientation questions were added into the National Survey of Family Growth (NSFG) in 2002.





Objectives

- To estimate the proportion of lesbian and bisexual women classified by different combinations of self-reported sexual identity and behavior;
- To estimate self-reported STD rates for those classified lesbian and bisexual women.







- The 2002 NSFG was used in this study: including a nationally representative sample of 7,643 women aged 15–44 years interviewed between March 2002 and March 2003.
- The overall response rate was 80% for women.
- All women were included in this study.





Sexual Behavior

There are 4 questions in NSFG:

 Male/female partners in entire life/past 12 months

- One of questions:
 - Thinking about your entire life, how many female sex partners have you had?

Sexual Identity

There is 1 question in NSFG:

- Do you think of yourself as heterosexual, homosexual, bisexual, or something else?
 - 1. Heterosexual
 - 2. Homosexual
 - 3. Bisexual
 - 4. Something else
 - 5. Don't know.



Viral STDs



There are 2 questions in NSFG:

- At any time in your life, have you ever been told by a doctor or other medical care provider that you had genital herpes?
 - 1.Yes
 - 2. No
- At any time in your life, have you ever been told by a doctor or other medical care provider that you had genital warts?
 - 1.Yes
 - 2. No



Classification of women's sexual orientation



- Category 1: sexual behavior:
 - Lesbians: only female partners in past 12 months
 - Bisexual: male and female partners in past 12 months
- Category 2: sexual identity:
 - Lesbians: homosexual
 - Bisexual: bisexual.
- Category 3: combined sexual identify and behavior
 - Lesbian:
 - ◆ Bisexual:
- Category 4: combined sexual behavior and identity
 - Lesbian:
 - ◆ Bisexual: SAFER • HEALTHIER • PEOPLE™





Classification of women's past STDs

Reported ever having had either genital herpes or genital warts.





Methods

- SAS and SUDAAN were used in analyzing the 2002 NSFG.
- Bivariate analyses and logistic regression models were used.
- A statistically significant difference was defined as a 2-tailed probability of <0.05.

Limitations



- Recall and reporting errors may occur, including the recall errors of having had a sex partner in the past 12 months and self-reported viral STDs;
- Some women might not disclose their sexual orientation and STDs because of their discomfort or fear;
- The study did not consider sexual attraction;
- The NSFG data used did not have state or regional information.
- The study did not include self-reported bacterial STDs in the past 12 months because of a very low rate.





Conclusions

- Estimated proportion of women aged 15-44 years in the United States:
 - ◆ 1.3%-1.9% for lesbian
 - ◆3.1%-4.9% for bisexual women
- Many ways to classify women's orientation according to women's responses to sexual behavior, identity, and attraction.
- Lesbian and bisexual women were not free from viral STDs, but the viral STD rates differed significantly:
 - ◆2.3%-6.7% for lesbian
 - ◆ 15.0%-17.2% for bisexual women
 - ◆8.7%-10.0% for heterosexual women
- Public health establishment should consider lesbian and bisexual women as separate population for STD prevention interventions.
