





What's The Bottom Line For You?

- ✓ Studies are of varying quality
- We know a lot about what went right, what went wrong, and what we can do to improve
- ✓ "Translational Research": converting what we know into what to do about what matters.

Lessons Learned: Pre-Disaster Planning

- ✓ Too little personal preparedness planning by individuals with disabilities
- ✓ Too little organizational disaster planning by agencies providing services to people with disabilities
- ✓ Too little planning for the needs of this population by emergency management agencies

■ Planning, Continued....

- ✓ Too few plans at all levels include strategies to keep health care facilities functioning in large-scale disasters
- ✓ Too few plans include effective strategies to coordinate and manage volunteer efforts in every phase of disasters.

- Planning, Continued....
 - ✓ "The majority of...plans cannot...manage catastrophic events"
 - ✓ "Both plans and exercises are scaled to familiar events"
 - √ "Think the unthinkable"

- Lessons Learned: Pre-Disaster Information & Communication
- ✓ Little or no communication exists between local emergency management agencies and individuals with disabilities
- ✓ Little or no communication exists between local disability organizations and emergency management agencies
- ✓ Few community education campaigns are targeted at people with disabilities.

Lessons Learned: Response

- ✓ Most initial search and rescue is carried out by citizens/survivors
- ✓ Individuals first turn to other members of "communities of interest" of which they are members
- ✓ Survivors arrive at shelters/ evacuation points/hospitals by private means, bypassing official systems



- Lessons Learned: Identifying & Locating People with Disabilities When Registries Failed, Why?
- ✓ They gave insufficient attention to what information is needed
- ✓ They gave insufficient attention to who will need the information, when
- ✓ They were overly complex
- ✓ They had an over-reliance on technology

Lessons Learned: Identifying & Locating People with Disabilities

- ✓ They failed to take into account local,
 "naturally-occurring" social networks or
 communities of interest
- ✓ They ignored registries of resources in addition to individuals

Prelude:

Many of the observations we have given in the summary of research are fairly well-known and will not come as a surprise. However, there still remains unmet needs and just because they are well-known does not make them less important.

- Research To Policy and Practice:
 Personal and Organizational
 Preparedness Planning
- ✓ The issue is not a lack of information and recommendations
- ✓ How do we translate them into policy and practice?
- ✓ What structures/mechanisms are there for dissemination and utilization?
- ✓ What principles of social marketing / incentives can be used?

Research To Policy and Practice: Community Planning

- ✓ There are too few programs developed to help communities increase their capacity to respond to people with disabilities
- ✓ "All response is local" which means communities are first line of defense

Research To Policy and Practice: Community Planning Continued

- ✓ We don't have enough practices, policies, and programs to help with this task.
- ✓ Additional knowledge mining and/or creation may be needed.

Research To Policy and Practice: Inclusion

- ✓ Federal policy says that people with disabilities must be actively involved in every phase of the planning process.
- ✓ Too often this does not happen.
- ✓ We need to develop effective mechanisms to bring about this involvement.

Research To Policy and Practice:
Information

Extensive informational resources exist for preparedness for people with disabilities.

✓ Too few comprehensive dissemination mechanisms exist to get this information out. Research To Policy and Practice:


✓ More attention needs to be given to additional clearinghouse activities.


Research To Policy and Practice: Additional Research Needs
