- Relationship: supervisor, peer
- Arrangement: assigned, random, criteria
- Location: local, distant
- Setting: work-based, school-based





- Recruitment
- Mentor characteristics (expertise)
- Quality of relationship ("match")
- Ease of use
- Mentor "over-use"
- Maintenance
- Evaluation





- Online programs exist
- Advantages
 - Characteristics—mentee can choose
 - Relationship—mentee can choose
 - Ease of use—no sign up needed
 - Mentor—can discontinue at any time; no obligation
 - Maintenance—not personnel intensive
- Disadvantages
 - Recruitment—difficult
 - Evaluation—more difficult
