Understanding State Public Health: Goals and Activities

<u>Goals</u>

- Promote analysis of relationship between infrastructure and health outcomes.
- Provide evidence for policy decisions.
- Assure consistent messages.
- Enhance public support for state public health services.
- Develop processes to deliver the message to constituencies.



- Build the necessary data set needed to gain a comprehensive understanding of state public health agency functions and infrastructure.
- Develop a description of state public health that articulates its meaning, value and importance.
- Market state public health to improve understanding among public health constituents, policy makers, funders and the public.
- Align efforts with the Voluntary National Accreditation Program.



Overarching Questions

- What are the commonalities that exist among state public health agencies?
 i.e. services offered, organizational structure, oversight provided.
- What makes state public health unique? What are the functions of a state public health agency that are not shared by local, county or regional public health agencies?
- What are the functional boundaries of state public health agencies? What public health service gaps exist among SPHAs?
- What do SPHAs look like across the nation? What are SPHAs activities and priorities?
- What is the SPHA's relationship to local health departments?
- What is the size of SPHAs across the nation?






Survey Results: Regulatory Activities






Survey Results: Data Collection






Survey Results: Population-based Primary Prevention






Survey Results: Epidemiology and Surveillance






Survey Results: Access to Care
