- Structural patterns







Eligibility Criteria

- Women who self identify as African American or Latina
- Women 18 years of age or older
- Women who live in the Bay Area
- Women who have had a least one male sex partner in the previous 12 months






Formative Findings: Gender Roles

Latina women talked about gender roles in relation to men, whereas African American women talked about gender roles in relation to society's expectation of African American women





GENDER ROLES







African-American Women

- Concern of public vs. private view of African-American women: "black women are strong in the street, but weak under the sheets..."
- Scarcity of African-American men leads women to hide independence or intelligence – " we have to dumb down for our men"
- Slave history made us survivors





Latina Women

- In order to be successful, women had to "put their sexuality out there" - your sexuality comes into play in your success
- We no longer need a man for money but want respect
- Latinas needing new "values" from men
- Decision making is often based solely on gender (because he's a man)





Economics & Social Capital

- More similarities based on class than those based on race/ethnicity
- Women with high SC were still perceived to be at risk for health issues and for STDs/HIV
- SC may work very different for women from low and high SES levels
- SC may be a vehicle for sexual risk






Methods

 - Street-based
 - Venue-based
 - Quasi-RDS
- Design (N=600); 4 data points
 - ACASI
 - Neighhood/Resource Maps
 - Qualitative component
 - Epi/neighborhood measures























Unwanted Sexual Experiences Prior to Age 18







Qualitative

- Think about all your sexual experiences as an adult and tell me about a sexual encounter you had that you later regretted doing?
- Many of us have an ideal partner in mind, what would your ideal partner be like?





Sexual Regrets

Having sex too young:

- "should have listened to my mother" "men only want one thing"
- Having sex in high school "I slept with him just because he was cute" felt uncomfortable around him and never spoke with him after it happened.

Having had too many sexual partners:

"I was a whore" at 18 started sleeping around; once arrested for prostitution regrets influencing friends to do what she was doing.

Having sex without really wanting to have sex:

- Having sex so boyfriend can leave her alone
- Having sex when she didn't want to with the guy she has been dating for 6 years. Feels obligated to have sex with him; if not, he would get mad and verbally abuse her. She is a little afraid of current boyfriend because he has shown some signs of abusive behavior like pushing her around and choking her, but she played it off like he was just playing around.





Summary

- No differences regarding:
 - Sex trade
 - Physical/ sexual assault in past six months
 - Rates of childhood sexual abuse
 - Rates of forced initiation of sexual behaviors
 - Proportion of those seeking uninhibited sexual encounters, enjoying X-rated videos
 - Large proportion of high-risk non-main partners
 - Low levels of consistent condom use
 - Proportion with concurrent relationships





Differences

Race/Class:

- Black women more likely to experience economic stress and death of close person in their life
- Black women have larger number of lifetime male partners
- Lower class Black women have higher proportion of MSW main partner
- Latina women more likely to want to explore sexuality and have new/exciting sexual experiences
- Higher class Latina women less likely to identify high risk partner and least likely to use condoms at last sex.
