- Innovative leader in the early childhood community

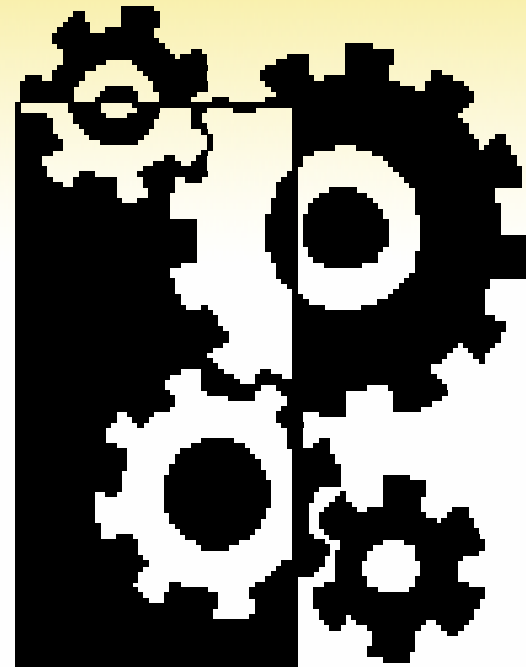
-expands its reach beyond the HS community through Knowledge Management.
