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Treatment Episode Data Set


- Client-level data on treatment admissions and discharges
- Primarily from facilities receiving public funds
- Estimated to include about 80% of all substance abuse treatment clients
- About 1.8 million admissions reported each year


- Demographics

- Substances of abuse

 - Treatment completion
 - Length of stay


Age at Admission: 2005




Distributions of US and TEDS Populations Age 50+: 2005




Admissions Age 50+: 1992-2005



Admissions Age 50+ by Primary Substance 1992-2005








Admissions Age 50+ by Primary Substance and Route of Administration: 2005



First-Time Admissions Age 50+ by Duration of Use of Primary Substance: 2005




Admissions Age 50+ by Year of First Use of Primary Substance: 2005




US and TEDS Male Population Distributions Age 50+: 2005




Admissions Age 50+ by Primary Substance, Race/Ethnicity, and Gender: 2005




Admissions Under 50 and Age 50+ by Service Setting: 2005




Referral Source by Age Group at Admission: 2005




Detailed Criminal Justice Referral by Age Group at Admission: 2005

Summary

- The increase in older admissions is expected to continue as "baby boomers" age.
- The substance abuse patterns of older treatment admissions differ from those of younger admissions.
- Older admissions get into treatment through different avenues than younger admissions.
- Despite long-standing substance use, many older admissions have not been in treatment before.
- These differences have implications for outreach and treatment services.
