








Progress towards the MDGs has been uneven

- There are also significant health benefits to reducing unmet need for family planning










Analyses have been completed in 31 countries




Methodology


- Project the population with no change in unmet need and with unmet need fulfilled
- Calculate the costs of meeting the MDGs for each projection
- Compare the cost projections and calculate the difference




Unintended pregancies will fall when unmet need is met...




... which reduces the number of school aged children




...which reduces the costs of meeting the primary education MDG



The savings resulting from reducing unmet need are greater than the costs



Meeting unmet need also has significant health benefits, too.




All countries analyzed show high savings ratios


Region	Range of ratios
Asia and Near East	4-13
Latin America and Caribbean	8-20
Sub-Saharan Africa	2-6.2

How have these analyses been used?

- CS committees in 4 LAC countries have used them for FP advocacy
- ➤ Presented to countries in Africa Union Ministers of Health meeting
- ➤ Used in budget negotiations in 2 ANE countries








