







Are Babies Breathing Clean Air?





Invisible Handrails






Clutter In The Exit Way




Dangerous Access To Hot Pipes

Healthy Homes for Childcare

Funded by the U.S. Housing & Urban Development agency

To protect children in home-based childcare from the risks of environmental health & safety hazards

Partnership between:

Philadelphia Department of Public Health, Pennsylvania's Department of Public Welfare

Nonprofit service providers and financing organizations

Healthy Homes for Childcare targets north and west Philadelphia

Specific zip codes:

- Areas with the highest incidence of childhood lead poisoning & asthma
- Most of the City's Family and Group Childcare facilities are located in these areas.
- These areas house the City's poorest residents in the oldest, most deteriorated homes
- Racial composition of the target area is 66.75% African-American, 3.34% Asian, 10.14% Hispanic, and 19.44% White.
- In families with children, 19.5% live at or below poverty level.
 (Based on year 2000 census data)



What does Healthy Homes for Childcare do?

 150 assessments in family and group child care homes and

 Provide remediation of hazards in 60 of those childcare homes.

Training of childcare providers on:



Part I: Comprehensive Assessment

- Test for the presence of lead
- Assess pest problems (implement IPM)
- Look for asthma triggers
- Assess food safety
- Evaluate fire safety and carbon monoxide hazards
- General child safety (handrails, stairs, etc).



Part II: Remediation

 For Family-based child care, \$6K, up to 6 kids in home.

 For Group-based child care, \$10K for 7-12 kids in home.

Contractors work for City of Philadelphia Department of Public Health



Part III: Education

- Crib safety
- Food Handling & Sanitation
- Pediatric/infant CPR
- Fire Safety
- Clutter control
- Emergency Preparedness







Results to date

- 134 Home-based childcare providers have applied
- 84 determined eligible
- 20 determined ineligible for program
- 82 homes received lead dust analysis
- 21 homes received remediation & superclean (32 homes approved, awaiting remediation)
- 50 homes received pest-free maintenance
- More than 500 childcare providers have received education thru workshops & presentations.

Tip of the Ice Berg...

A 2005 report documents

- 868 licensed home-based child care businesses in Philadelphia
- 4542 not licensed
