Why State of the States?

- States are policy laboratories
- Governors are important players
- Governors establish legislative, budget and, indirectly, media agendas

Major Trends

- According to Nodine,
 - Education (51/51)
 - Health care (48/51)
 - Environment (47/51)
 - Initiatives to Develop a Knowledge-Based Economy (46/51)
 - Initiatives to Foster Development of Traditional Business (42/51)
 - Homeland Security, Disaster Prep/Information Infrastructure (27/51)

Health Care Trends

- According to Nodine:
 - 21/51 discussed health care proposals for the elderly
 - 20/51 described efforts to reform Medicaid
 - 18/51 described wellness, prevention, and early intervention programs
 - 12/51 described Health IT

Health Care, cont'd

- 16 described initiatives related to health care quality and consumer choice
- 15 described either mental health or mental health and substance abuse treatment
- 12 mentioned prescription drug costs
- 10 described initiatives to help health care workforce

- 4 described smoking cessation programs
- 3 described childhood obesity
- 2 described family planning
- 2 described a smoking ban
- 1 described autism
