
SATHCAP: The Role of Drug Use in Sexual Transmission of HIV

 Study initiated and funded by the National Institute on Drug Abuse (NIDA) to examine the transmission of HIV among drug-using populations and from drug-using to non-drug using populations


Dual Risk Group Recruitment

- Simultaneous sampling of two primary and potentially overlapping risk groups using respondent-driven sampling (RDS)
 - drug users (cocaine/crack, heroin, methamphetamine, injection drug users)
 - men who have sex with men (MSM)
- Secondary sample of sex partners and a tertiary sample of 'partners of partners'


Dual Risk Group Recruitment



Drug users and MSM recruit sex partners




Sex partners recruit their sex partners



Respondent Driven Sampling (RDS)

- Variant of chain-referral sampling
- Start with non-randomly selected "seeds"
- Participants receive a limited number of coupons to recruit eligible peers
- Recruitment continues over multiple "waves"


Respondent-Driven Sampling (RDS)

Sex Practices Data

- Last time had sex with partner, past 6 months
 - we ask about 3 most recent partners
 - If the 3 most recent partners did not include main partner, IDU partner, or female partner we also asked about them
- If >3 sex partners, we asked global questions about sex practices with any partners, past 6 months
 - 62% of MSMW had >3 sex partners
 - 29% of heterosexual men had >3 sex partners

MSM/W: anal sex common with male & female partners

<u>Women</u>: correlates of anal sex with men

- Primary/main sex partner**
- Gave partner money/drugs for sex**
- Younger age*
- Met male partner > 6 mo/<5 yrs. ago*
- Education beyond high school*
- Bisexual identity
- Bisexual behavior*
- Injected drugs
- * p.<.05, ** p.<.01 in multivariate analysis

MSMW: Type of sex partner varies by sex

Main	46%	22%
Friend, etc., but not main	63%	73%
Stranger	13%	14%
Trade	6%	11%
