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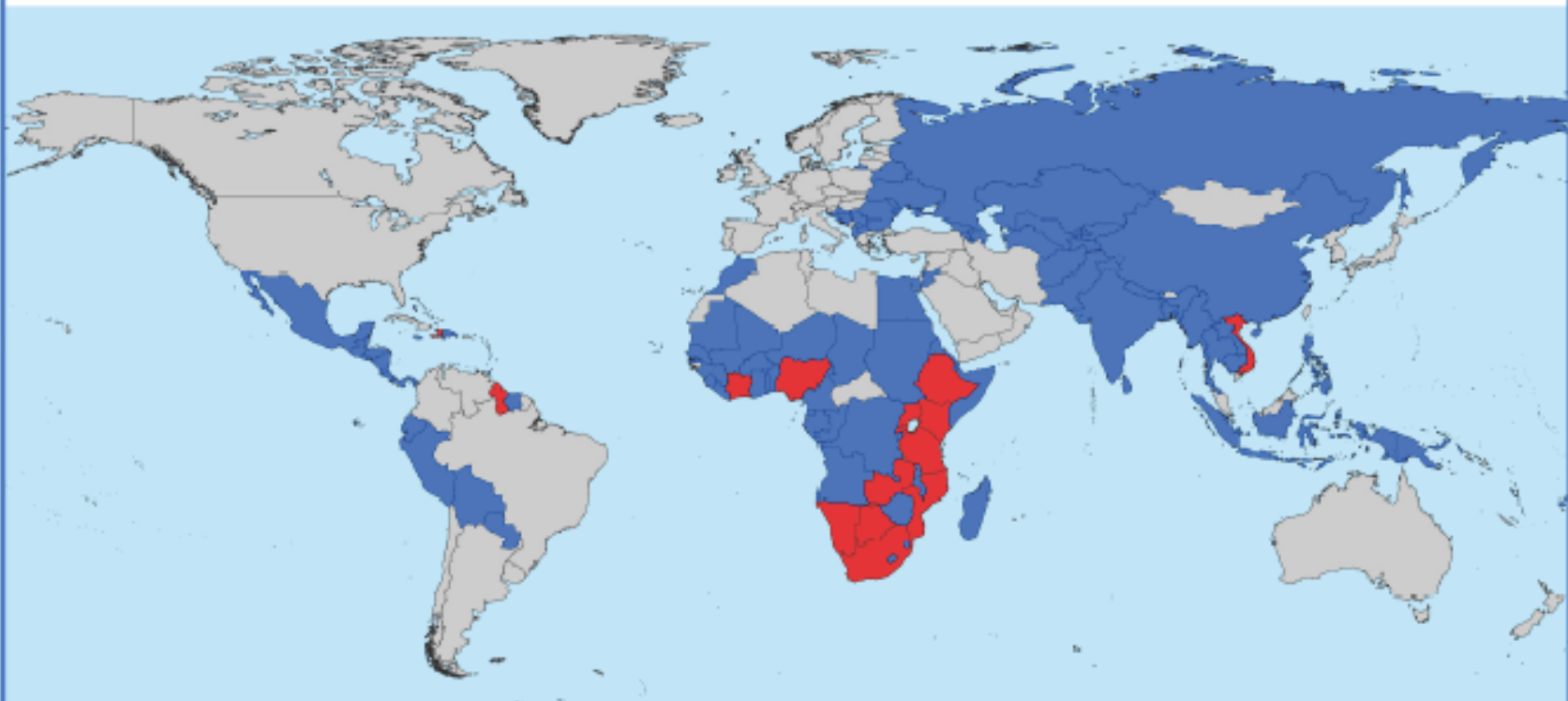

Total number of clients receiving HIV Care and Support (Palliative Care = general clinical care, OI, TB, HBC, other palliative) + OVC



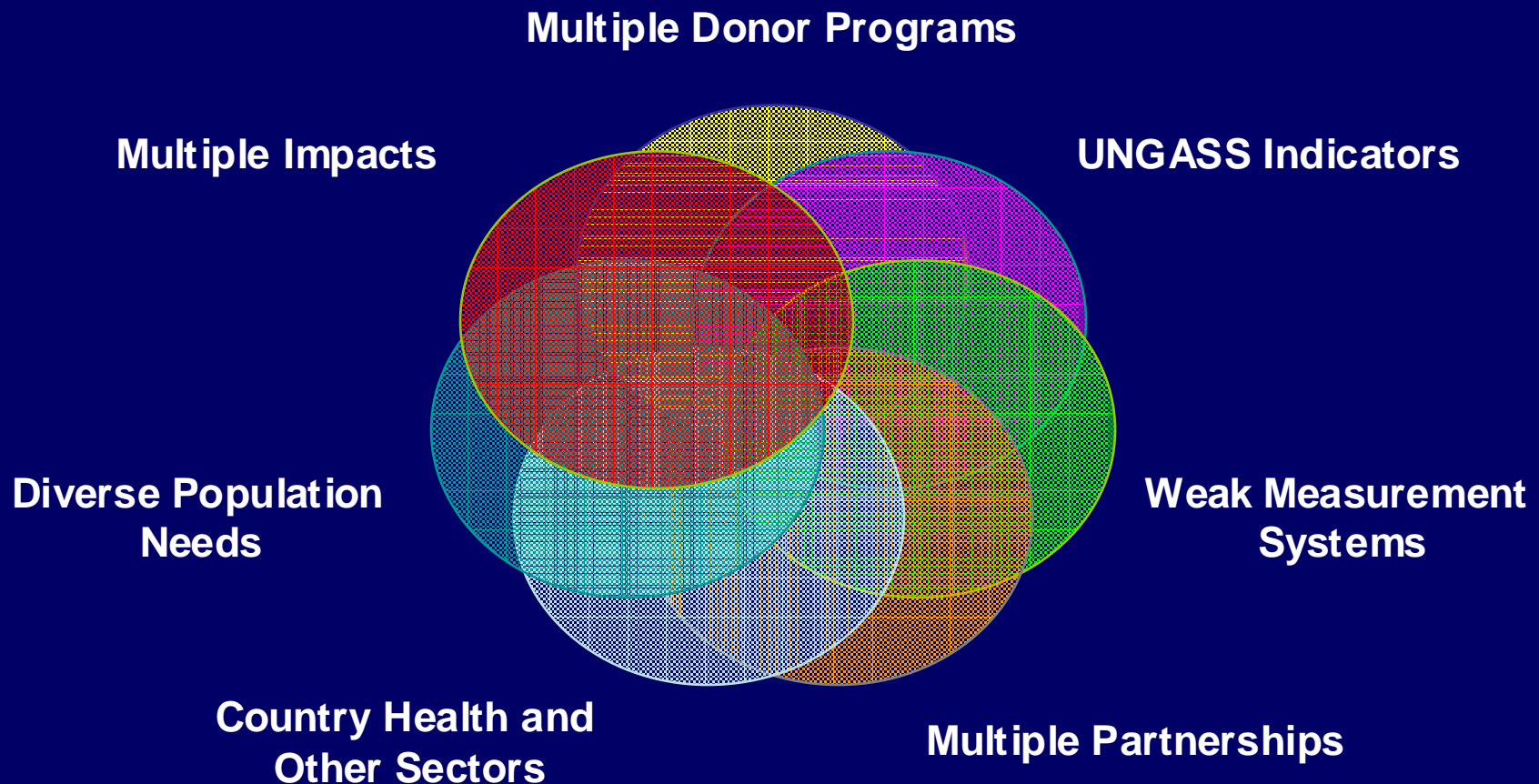
# PEPFAR CORNERSTONE

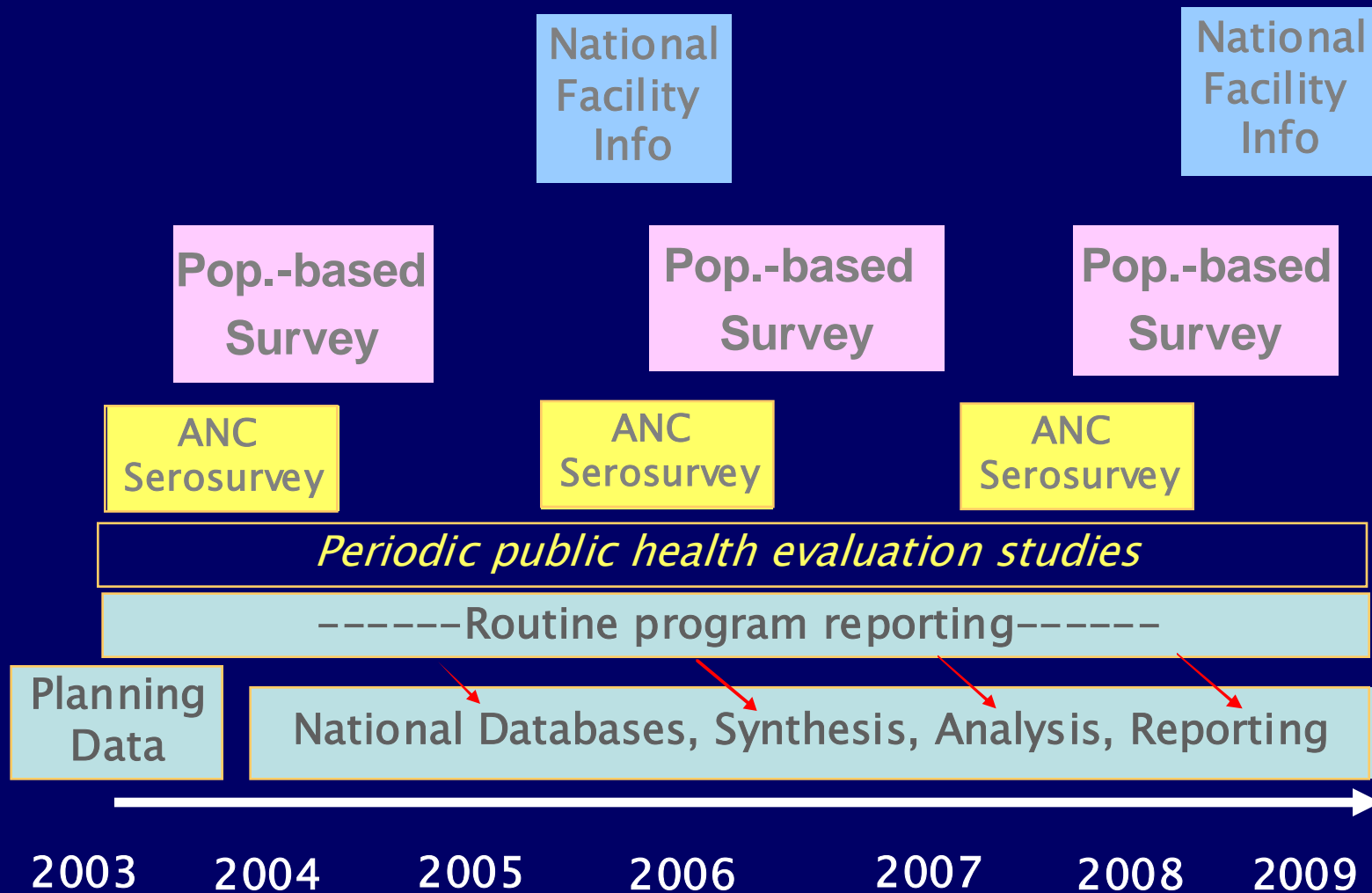

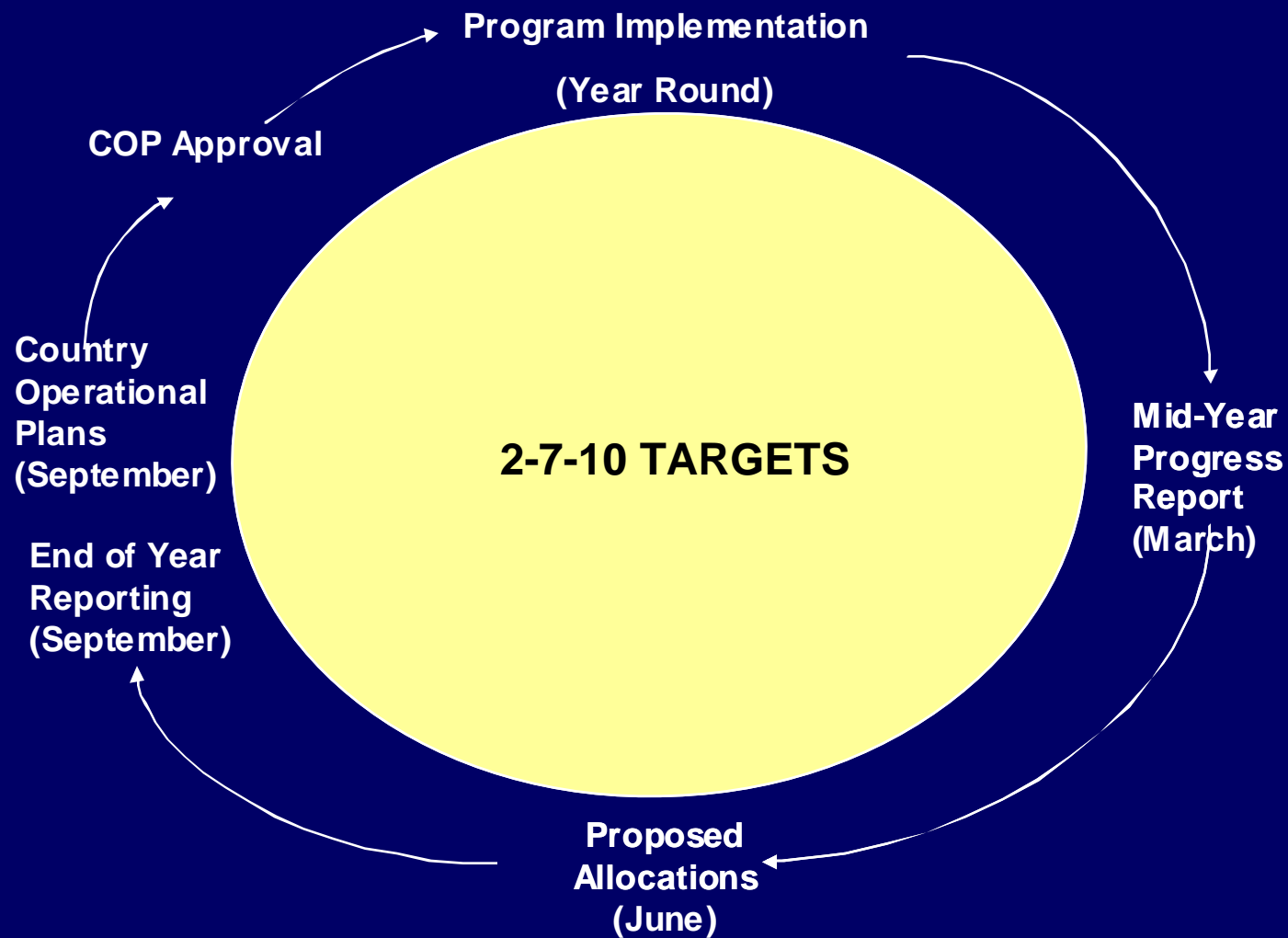

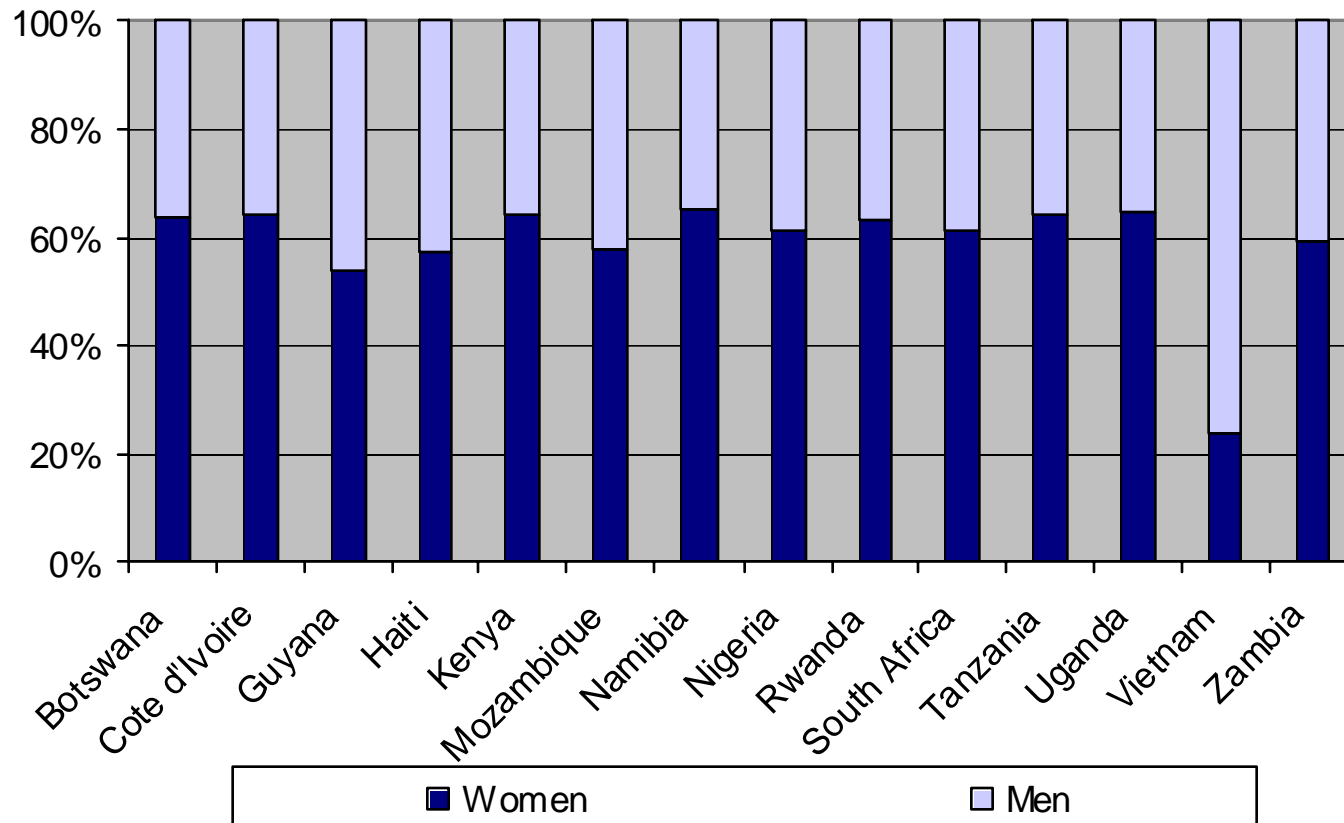

Focus Countries

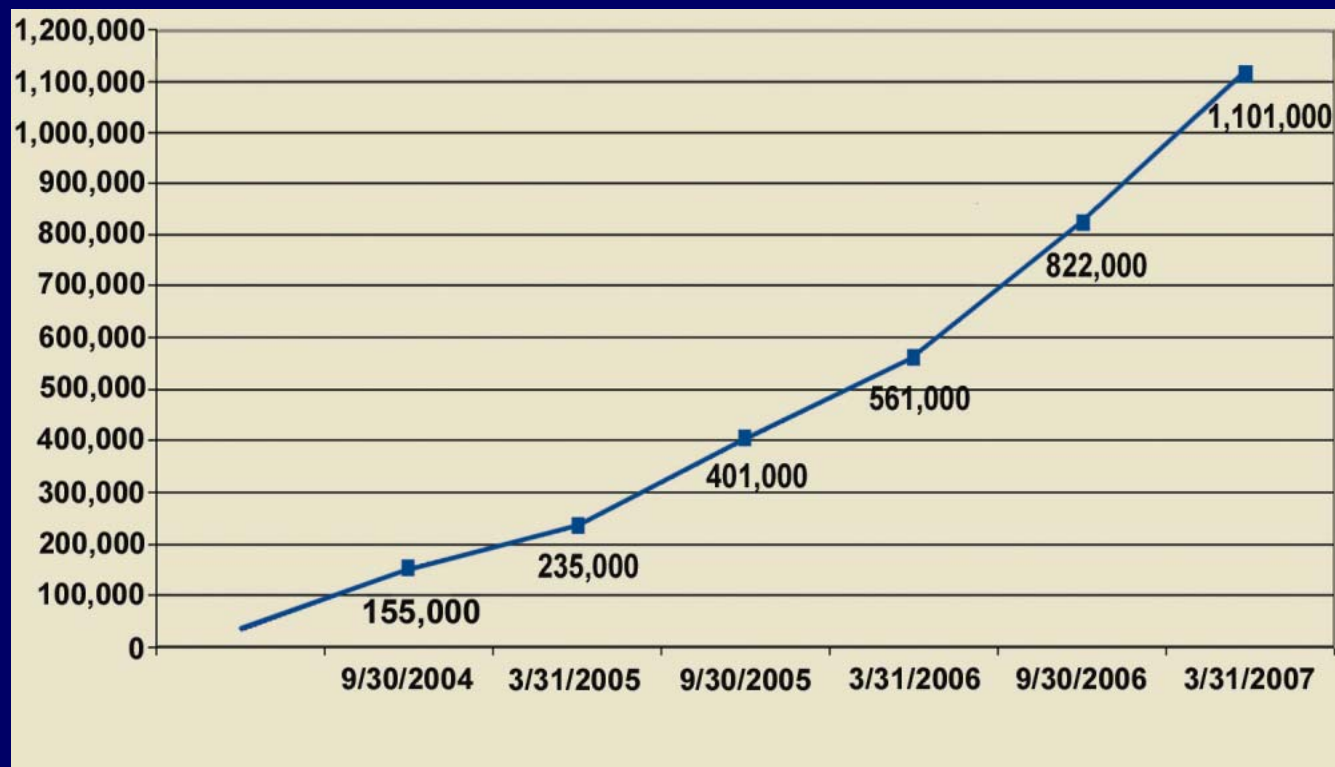






## Trend: Treatment in the 15 Focus Countries

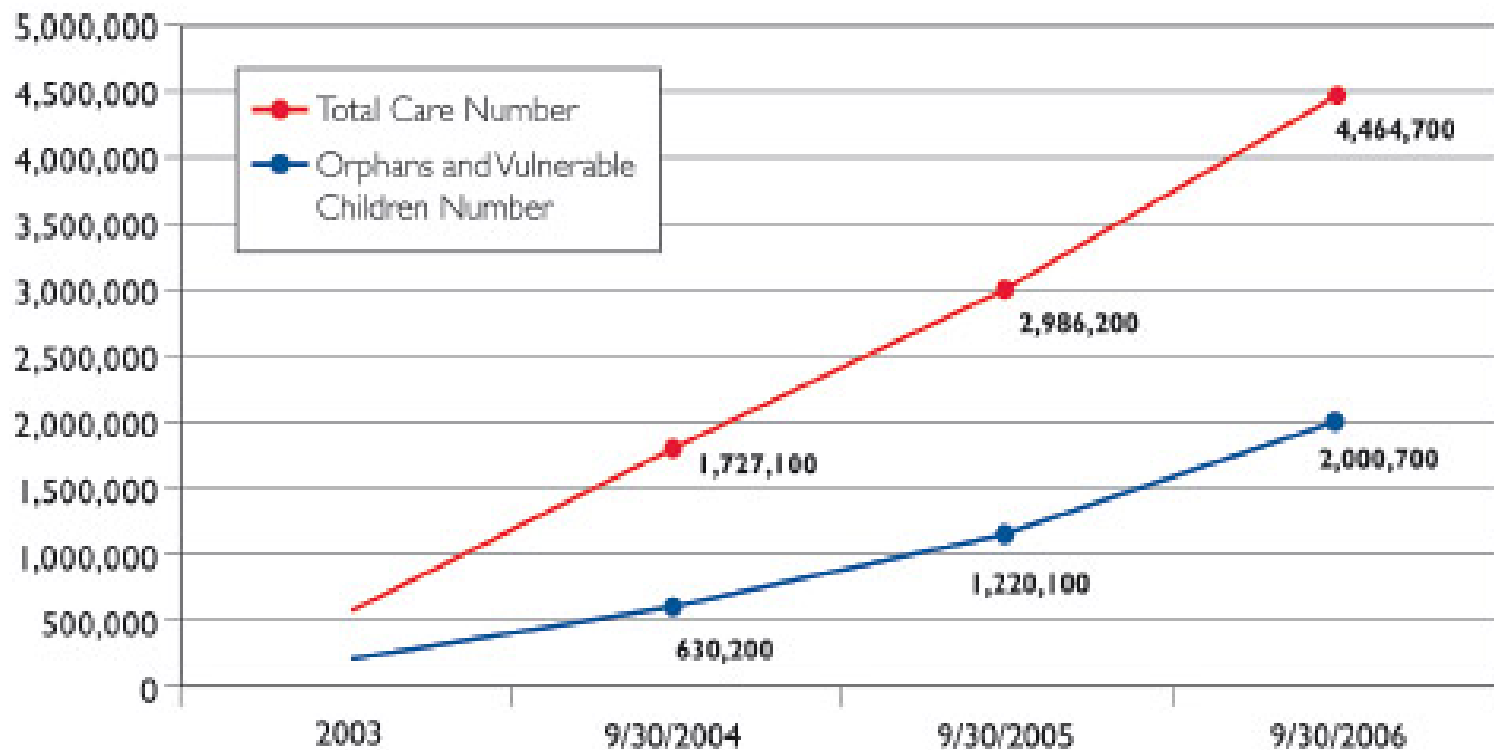
**Number of Individuals Receiving Antiretroviral Treatment**

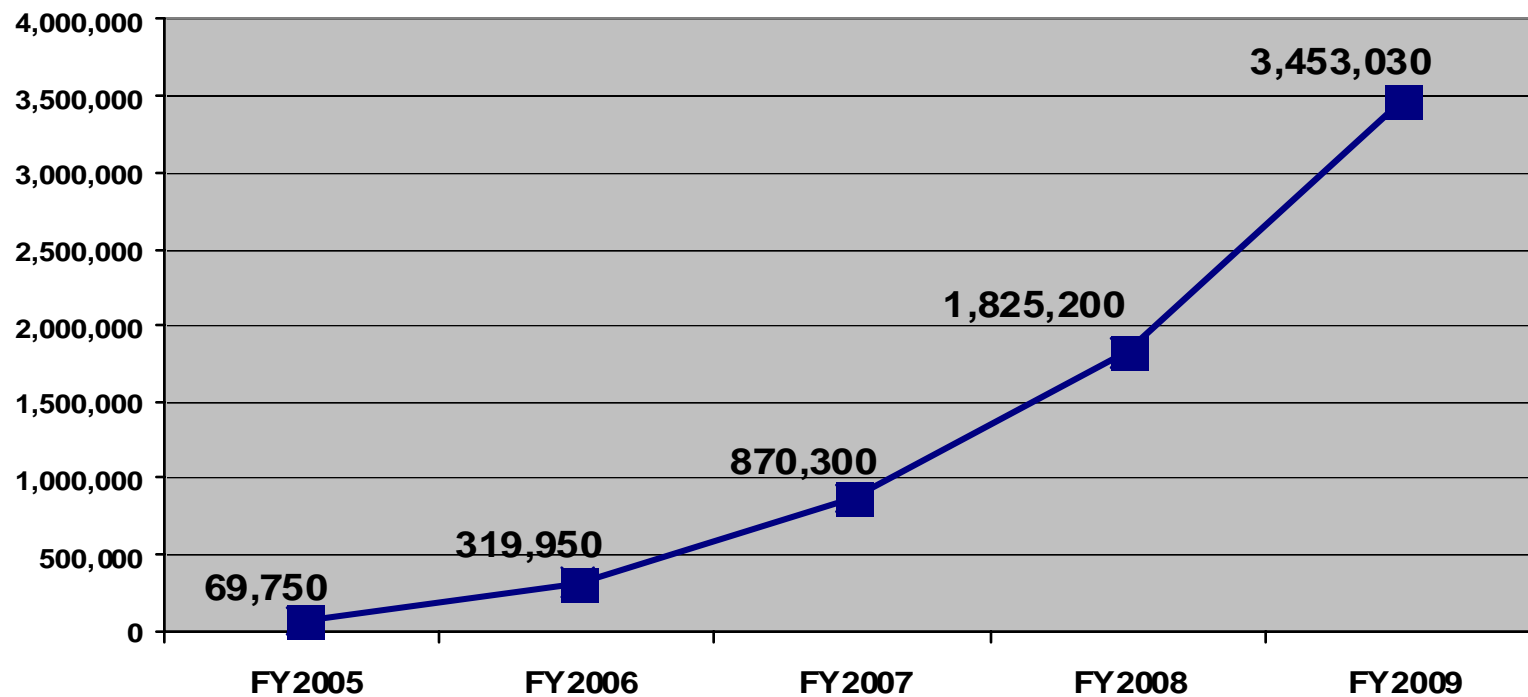

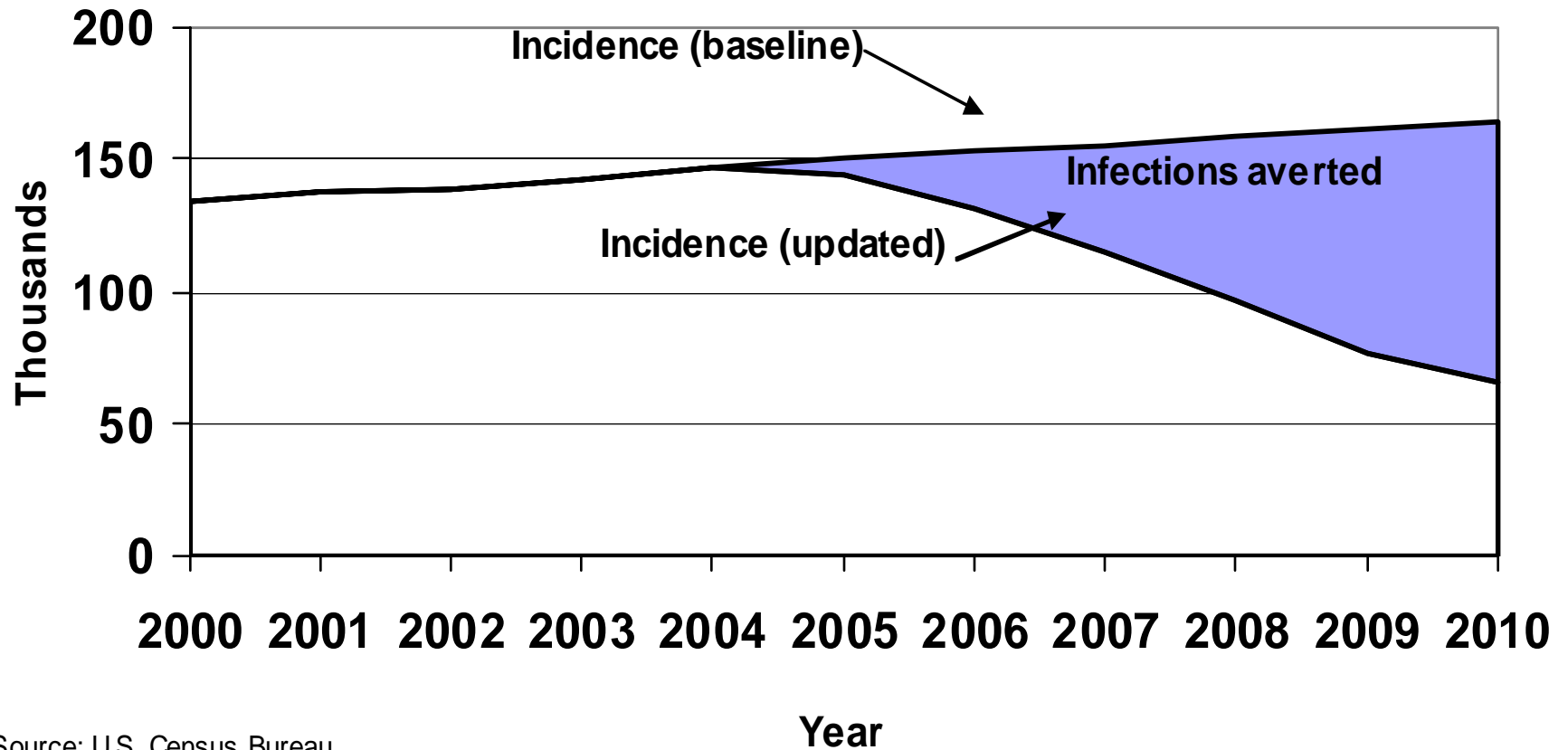
