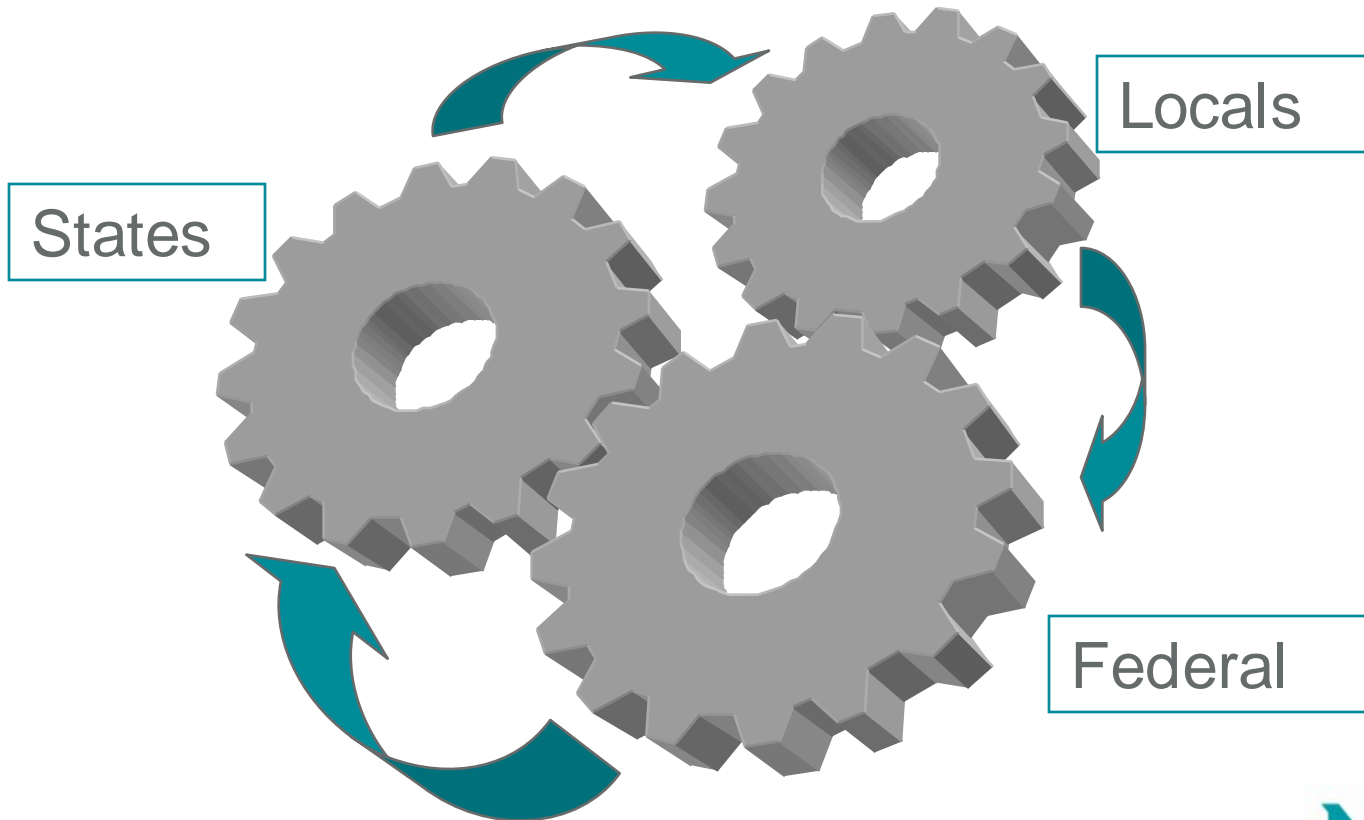
Partnering with EPA
