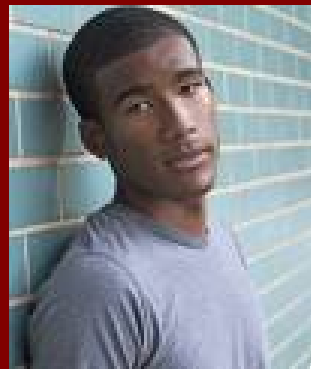

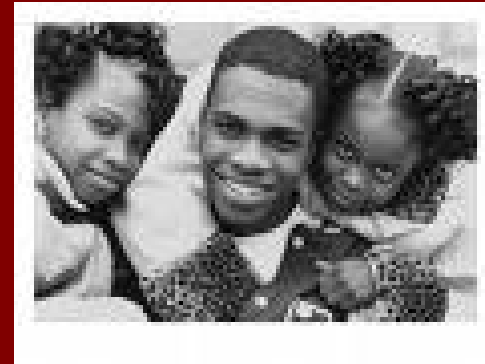
Multi-problem Youth: Who Are These Children?

John is 16 and currently lives in a therapeutic foster home. He has a history of running away and is currently on the run. His father is incarcerated and his mother resides in a therapeutic community.



Multi-Problem Youth

- Homeless
- In out-of-home care
- Children of parents with substance use disorders
- Children of parents with histories of incarceration

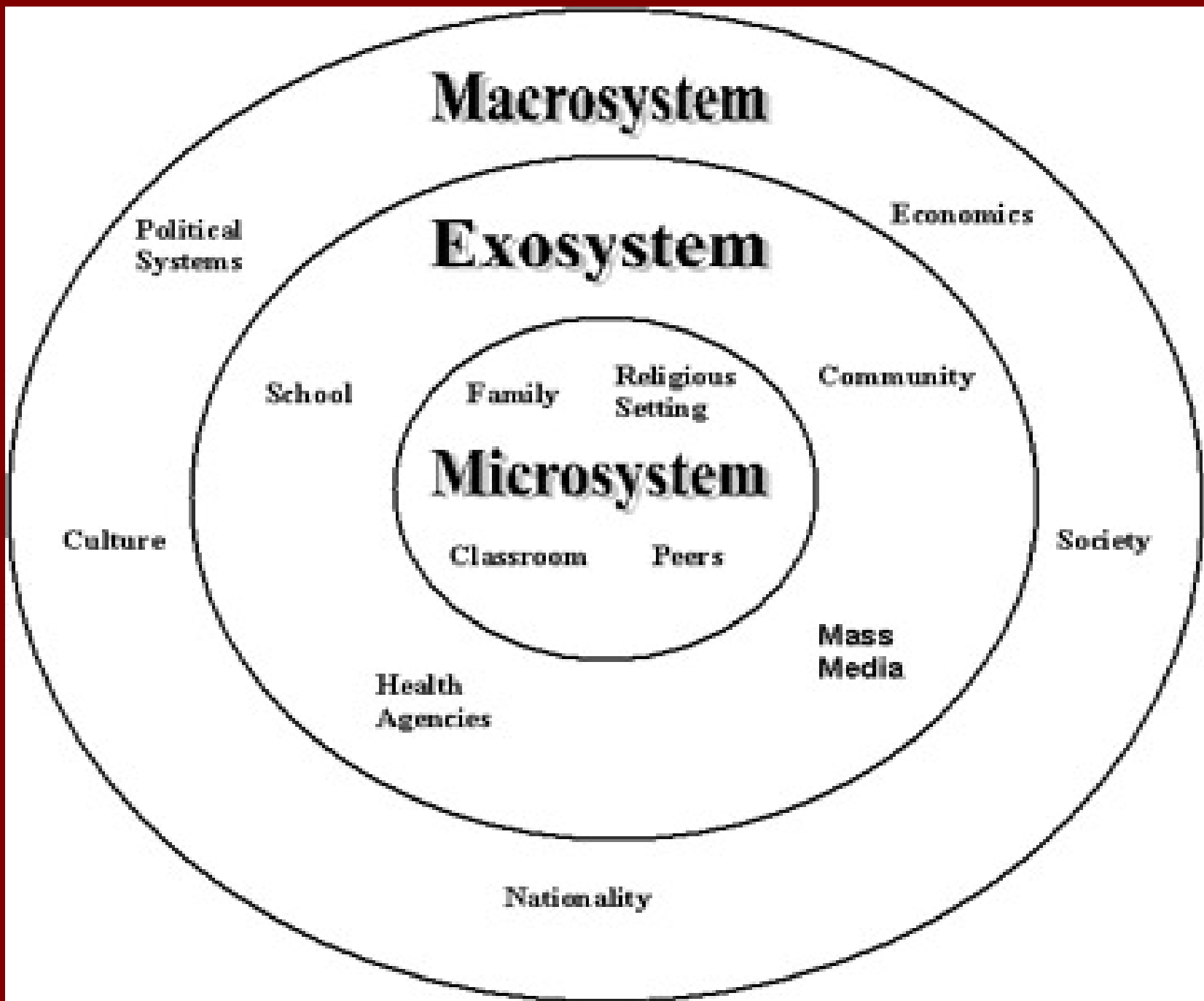


What We Know About High Risk Behavior

Individuals engage in high risk activities not because they lack relevant **information** but because they lack behavioral and cognitive **skills** to use available information.

8 Key Components of Prevention Services for Youth at High Risk

1. Adolescent Specific Services
2. Focus on Basic Needs
3. Interagency Case-management & Collaboration
4. Outreach
5. Peer Education & Training
6. Wide Referral Network
7. Youth Involvement (Staff & Volunteers)



Factors that influence Risk

- Macro:
 - Poverty (limited or lack of resources)
 - Extra-curricular activities
 - Quality of education
 - Homelessness
- Exosystem
 - Level and type of community criminal activity
 - Difficulty of access to substances within the community
- Microsystem
 - Family Instability & Disruption
 - Lack of parental supervision
 - Parental involvement with Justice System (Probation, Parole, or Incarceration)
 - Parental Substance Abuse



Factors that influence Risk

- Individual
 - History of physical, emotional, or sexual abuse
 - Behavioral or emotional difficulties
 - Do the youth have the information?
 - » Information on protective practices and substances
 - Do they possess the behavioral and cognitive skills?
 - » Refusal skills
 - » Planning & problem-solving skills
 - » Decision making & assertive communication skills
 - Do they have the support?
 - » Positive relationships with adults

Lessons Learned from Programs Serving High Risk Youth

- Networking & Working Agreements Are Paramount
 - Juvenile Justice System
 - Foster Care System
 - Mental Health System
 - Social Services
 - Group Homes
 - Shelters
- Case-Management Takes Time
- System Changes May Be Necessary
 - Healthcare Policy
- Community Norms Can Be Obstacles
