



The Challenge


How to engage in HIV education

- HCPs not offering HIV C&T

- Address health disparities






The Inspiration

- instead social context & social capital






Social Capital as a Model

- Adapted from sociology & economic theories
- Resources embedded in relationships
- Explanatory mechanism
- KEY new ave of intervention






Social capital & Training

- Adult learning is social
- Social Capital effects:
 - Participation
 - Clinical practice
- Matched own AETC research






Translates as a

- Need for information about social networks
- Concern with transfer knowledge
 - Formally
 - Informally
- Devote resources to building relationships


Emphasis on collaborative learning

NY/NJ AETC Programs

- Individual level
 - HIV Certificate Program
- Community level
 - Focused intensive outreach & assessments
 - Identify no & low volume
 - Link to AETC/HIV community








- NP Clinical Management Track
 - Provided HIV care but inconsistently
- Multi AETC collaboration
- Membership in GNY ANAC
- Seen as local HIV resource
- ACCESS challenge
 - Low enrollment of PCPs & non-LTS






Tricks & Tips

- Flexible preceptorships
- Pharm reps






Conclusions

- Successful: new linkages btwn experts & frontline providers
