Why Healthy Eating, Active Living: Anatomy of an Epidemic

- Obesity: #2 cause of preventable deaths in U.S.
- Medical care alone not sufficient
- Major drivers of the obesity epidemic are environmental:
 - Built environment discourages physical inactivity
 - More food than we can eat
 - Much of what is marketed is high calorie, low in nutrients



Why Healthy Eating, Active Living

Comprehensive environmental and social change is *required* to turn down the epidemic

Because our members and community residents can't be healthy if they live and work in unhealthy communities


KP's Community Health Initiatives Strategy
