




Healthy People: What is it?

 Preserve Independence for Older Adults

• Reduce Premature Deaths of Infants, Children, and Adolescents



Healthy People - Evolution Healthy People 2000 Goals

- Increase span of healthy life
- Reduce health disparities
- Increase access to clinical preventive services
- Age specific targets continued

- Eliminate health disparities






Healthy People – Expanding Area of Focus

Organizing Framework

 - Secondary: Diseases and disorders
- Emphasis on Public Health Priorities
 - Prevention
 - Health IT
 - Preparedness

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Healthy People: A Regional Perspective

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Office of the Regional Health Administrator

- US is divided up into 10 Regional Offices
- Each Operating Division of the Department is organized differently
- Each Regional Office has a Regional Health Administrator, the highest ranking federal health and public health official in the Region

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




