

The FCA FCTC Monitor

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World Health Organization (WHO) Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (FCTC)

- This historic document is the first international legal instrument designed to promote national action and global cooperation to counter the worldwide spread of the tobacco epidemic.
- The FCTC was adopted by member states of the WHO in 2003 and entered into force on 27 February 2005.
- Currently, 151 countries have ratified the treaty.
- Latest Party: Angola 20 September 2007



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The preamble of the FCTC states that Parties are:

"Emphasizing the special contribution of nongovernmental organizations and other members of civil society to tobacco control efforts ..."

Article 21: Reporting & exchange of information

"Each Party shall submit to the Conference of the Parties, through the Secretariat, periodic reports on its implementation of this Convention ..."

Conference of the Parties – Decision related to Article 21

- Parties agreed to a graduated reporting system under which they are required to report on some FCTC Articles two years after the FCTC enters into force - other Articles after 5 years and others after 8 years.
- Parties agreed that their objective in reporting "is to enable Parties to learn from each others" experience in implementation"
