Designed to teach new skills

Scientific Sessions

Designed and developed to relay information about a study, activity or event

Provide for indepth, comprehensive study of subject matter Scientific Sessions

Solicited from members with focus on research and its use by the Public Health field

Scientific Sessions

Enable learners to receive hands-on skill enhancing instructions Do not equip learner with "how to" skills

Scientific Sessions

Offered to address member-identified gaps in skill development Provide latest research results and program outcomes

Scientific Sessions

Allotted time much more extensive

Usually 90 minutes long and didactic in nature

Scientific Sessions

Held immediately prior to annual meeting Presented during APHA annual meeting

Consist of limited number of concentrated continuing education courses to promote skills enhancement Scientific Sessions

Provide little time for questions, interaction with presenter

Submitted in response to call for proposals Scientific Sessions

Abstracts submitted on topic of choice by public health field

Reviewed by Continuing Education Subcommittee of APHA Education Board Scientific Sessions

Reviewed by Sections, SPIGS, Caucuses and their leadership

Past years' reviews are considered in identifying education and technical assistance
