- 1999: Latin American School of Medicine (LASM) opens in Havana, Cuba.
- 2000: Congressman from Mississippi asks for Cuba's medical Assistance. Fidel responds.
- **2001**: First Group of U.S. Students in Havana.
- 2005: First U.S. Student Graduates from LASM.
- 2007: Eight U.S. Students Graduate. Approximately 100 U.S. Students in LASM.

- Medical degree in Family Medicine


