# **Health Day at the Capitol:** Fostering collaboration and active roles in policy development

The Kansas Public Health Association (KPHA) is the oldest and largest organization of public health professionals in the state, representing more than 600 members. KPHA brings together researchers, health service providers, administrators, teachers, and other health workers in a unique, multidisciplinary environment of professional exchange, study, and action.

#### INTRODUCTION

For the last three years, Kansas Public Health Association has organized and facilitated a multiagency Health Day at the Capitol intended to foster partnerships and develop legislative relationships between health advocates, health leaders, and policy makers to address the core function of policy development.

### **METHODS**

- collaborated with health policy student
- health fair (information, blood pressure checks, body fat analysis, cholesterol screenings)
- healthy snacks & prize drawings
- advocacy training KPHA members
- rally on the capitol steps
- legislative reception/lunch
- invitations to practitioners using several email list serves, electronic newsletters, & linked coalitions
- email & hand delivered invitations to legislators
- National Public Health Week proclamation from the governor

#### **RESULTS**

- Over 40 vendor/agencies participated 2006 & 2007
- Key health policy leaders addressed participants
- Advocates met with legislators & health policy staff
- KPHA members received training; new policy tools
- A new multi-agency health alliance formed

The Alliance for Health Advocates has 35 member organizations who meet weekly during the legislative session to track health legislation.
