

HEALTHY SEXUALITY IN FIRST GRADERS: SEXUAL ABUSE PREVENTION PROGRAM

Introduction

The problem of sexually abused children has significantly increased in Mexico during the last decades. According to some reports, the average age of victimized children is 5.7 years old. However, violence against children in specific regions like the United States-Mexico border has underscored the importance of examining the extent and efficacy of preventive initiatives on this phenomenon.

Purpose

Present the main results of a prevention program on sexual abuse in the City of Tijuana among six year old children, focusing on sexual health issues.

Methodology

The targeted population was four groups of first grade children at two public elementary schools, with low household income. The targeted population of this program was four groups of first grade children at two public elementary schools. This program was organized into thirteen workshops and divided in three different themes.

RESULTS

Children's responses showed differences between groups related to the extent of their curiosity and their acceptance of the themes.

The outcomes were more significant in some of the areas than others. However, we could confirm that the purpose of the program was achieved, given that the post-test reflects acquisition of knowledge about the body including genitals, the importance of self protection and caring. Likewise, it was observed an increase in the children's abilities to communicate more assertively their needs and feelings. There was also an increase in the number of people they are willing to speak up in a risk situation, as well as their ability to determine to whom demonstrate affection and in which manner.

Finally, throughout all the sessions the children displayed a significantly positive attitude toward sexuality.

CONCLUSIONS

We conclude that this kind of preventive programs among first graders is deeply needed in contexts like this, thus reducing the likelihood of sexual abuse on this and later stages of their development.
