

How to participate in the medicine collection

RxMEDS is a free and environmentally safe medicine disposal program being offered at selected Schnucks Pharmacies. NO REFUNDS OR EXCHANGES WILL BE PERMITTED.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

The research program is for individuals or households only. Materials will not be accepted from health centers, doctors' offices, or other organizations.

WHAT TO BRING TO SCHNUCKS?

YES: Expired or unwanted prescriptions & medicines.
Over-the-counter medicines.

NO: Thermometers, needles, or medical & household waste.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN?

A pharmacist will supervise collecting medicine and recording data for research. All medicine collected will be sent to a hazardous waste facility for safe incineration. NO MEDICINE WILL BE RE-USED OR RE-SOLD.

WHAT ABOUT MY PRIVACY?

Do not empty your medications into another container or bag. Keep them in the container in which you received them, if possible. You may mark out your name for privacy. Be sure to leave information about the medication visible.

NO PERSONAL INFORMATION REQUIRED!

You will be asked only a few questions, such as your zip code, why the medicine is no longer wanted, how long they've been kept, and how you heard about the program.

The 3 Main Hazards

Theft of medicines may lead to inappropriate use and/or identity theft.



Medicines washed down the sink or toilet contaminate rivers. This causes reproductive and growth problems in fish and other aquatic wildlife.
