



- Enabled world-wide providers to participate

 - With no transportation/registration/CEU expenses
- Strengthened connection of tribal providers, IHS, universities, hospices, state organizations worldwide, palliative care providers & educators

- Over 400 registrants
- Symposium cost less than previous onsite offerings
 - \$28,000 vs. \$125,000
- Registration/continuing education offered at no cost
