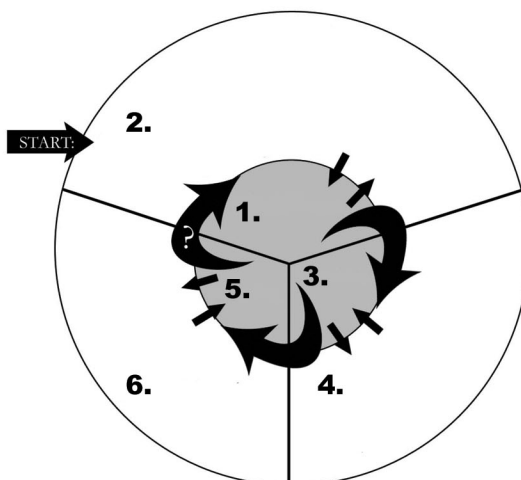
Learning Objectives:
