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# Introduction

## Background

This is the Department of Civil Service's third annual report, "New York State Government Employees' Workers' Compensation Claims." It is the first report to include workers' compensation experience from three fiscal years (2009/2010, 2008/2009 and 2007/2008).

*Section 7 of the Civil Service Law* was amended in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007 (Appendix A of this report) to require that the President of the Civil Service Commission prepare an annual report describing occupational injuries, illnesses and workers' compensation claims in Executive Branch state agencies. The report is required to be published by September thirtieth each year and include worker's compensation data based on the last completed fiscal year. In subsequent years, the report shall include comparative data for up to five fiscal years. A similar report was published by the Department of Civil Service from 1986 through 1992.

The report format follows the sections specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007. Tables 2A and 2B consolidate subdivisions **(6b)** and **(6c)** of the legislation and Table 3 consolidates subdivisions **(6d)** and **(6e)** of the legislation.

The Department of Civil Service, Employee Benefits Division, is responsible for overseeing the workers' compensation insurance policy between New York State and the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF). Part of this responsibility includes the reporting and monitoring of workers' compensation experience through the Accident Reporting System (ARS) and a summary of workers' compensation claims experience provided by the NYSIF. Workers' compensation data for this report are obtained from both ARS and NYSIF. Employee population data are obtained from the Department of Civil Service New York State Electronic Personnel System (NYSTEP).

As previously noted, workers' compensation data was obtained from two different databases: NYSIF and ARS. Use of the two databases was necessitated by the reporting requirements specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007. Neither database contained a complete picture of the information required for this report. As a result, there is a slight difference in the number of cases contained in each database. The difference is due to cases being reported to NYSIF but not to ARS as a result of manual reporting for employees not eligible for an ARS report and the use of "small claims" by NYSIF in which an incident results in only one medical bill and no lost time and is not indexed by the Workers' Compensation Board. The small claim often does not result in an incident report being submitted through ARS.

Information in this report is presented in a summary manner at a summary level. New York State agency Human Resources and Health and Safety staff are encouraged to use the reporting capabilities of the ARS, which will allow for much greater detail of the information presented in this report, as well as many other workers' compensation incident details.

## **Explanatory Notes**

The report *includes* selected Executive branch agencies' Classified Service employees consistent with subdivision three of section two-a of the State Finance Law. The report *excludes* the Judicial and Legislative branches, as well as the Unclassified Service and Authorities, as the Department of Civil Service does not maintain employee data on these groups.

Information in this report is based on New York State workers' compensation claims filed by the included employees. Although the reporting period is by fiscal year 2009/2010 (April 1, 2009 through March 31, 2010), 2008/2009 (April 1, 2008 through March 31, 2009) and 2007/2008 (April 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008), claims for fiscal years were reviewed until July 1 of the reporting year to allow for late reporting and for the data to be captured in which workers' compensation determinations were made after the end of the fiscal year.

Incident data included in this report are for work related incidents, either injuries or occupational illnesses that were reported to the Workers' Compensation Board and the State Insurance Fund as required by the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. The Law requires reporting of all incidents that result in either: one or more lost work days beyond the date of the incident or medical treatment beyond first aid or two or more first aid treatments. There are many incidents that do not reach the level of the reporting criteria under the Workers' Compensation Law.

This report includes statutory workers' compensation costs incurred by Executive Branch employees covered under the policy with the New York State Insurance Fund. The reported compensation costs *do not include* enhanced benefits awarded through binding arbitration or negotiated through collective bargaining, specifically: workers' compensation leave at full pay benefit; and workers' compensation supplemental pay program.

## Executive Summary

Highlights are presented below for NYS Executive Branch agency workers' compensation incidents for classified employees incurred in Fiscal Years (FY) 2009/2010, 2008/2009 and 2007/2008. As this is the third report, only three years of data are available.

- There were 15,643 work related claims in FY 2009/2010 compared to 15,916 claims in FY 2008/2009 and 15,846 claims in FY 2007/2008 (Table 1, page 15).
- The overall workers' compensation incident rate was 9.9% in both FY 2009/2010 and FY 2008/2009 compared to 9.6% in FY 2007/2008 (Table 1, page 15).
- The lost time incident rate increased slightly in FY 2009/2010 to 2.9% from 2.8% in FY 2008/2009 (Table 2A, page 25)
- Slightly over 29% of workers' compensation incidents in FY 2009/2010 resulted in lost time. There were 4,564 lost time incidents resulting in 281,295 lost work days in FY 2009/2010. Both the number of lost time incidents and number of lost work days have increased in the past two years (Table 2B, page 34).
- There was an increase in both total compensation and medical costs from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010. Total compensation cost increased from \$22,770,590 to \$25,293,052, slightly over 11%. Total medical cost increased from \$20,636,439 to \$22,657,840, nearly 10%. (Table 3, page 44).
- Soreness and pain - excluding the back accounted for approximately one-third of all types of injuries in FY 2009/2010, FY 2008/2009, and FY 2008/2007. Sprains, strains, tears and bruises, contusions were the next most frequent types of injuries in the three fiscal years reported (Table 4A, page 46).
- The leading incident causes in all three fiscal years reported were: falls, bodily reaction and exertion, and overexertion in lifting (Table 4B, page 48).
- The top three body parts injured in all three fiscal years were: the back, knee, and shoulder (Table 4C, page 52).
- For the third year in a row, the three job titles with the highest number of incidents were: Correction Officer, Developmental Aide, and Mental Health Therapy Aide. Security Hospital Treatment Assistant had the highest incident rate in the three fiscal years reported (Table 5, page 55).
- The two agencies with 500 or more employees with the highest incident rates in FY 2009/2010 were Kingsboro Psychiatric Center and Bronx Psychiatric Center. (Table 6, page 58).
- In the FY 2009/2010, FY 2008/2009 and FY 2007/2008, the Administrative Services Unit had the lowest incident rate, and the Institutional Services Unit had the highest incident rate (Table 7, page 62).

**Table 1** lists the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies' workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (6a). The information in Table 1 was provided by the New York State Insurance Fund. The 2009/2010 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2009 and March 31, 2010 and reported through June 30, 2010. The 2008/2009 and 2007/2008 claims experience is the same data reported in last year's report.

There were a total of 15,643 workers' compensation incidents reported and an incident rate of 9.9% in FY 2009/2010 compared to 15,916 incidents and an incident rate of 9.9% in FY 2008/2009; and 15,846 incidents and an incident rate of 9.6% in FY 2007/2008.

Two large agencies (3,000 employees or more) experienced a notable increase in incident rate from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010: the Office of Children and Family Services (19.6% to 21.3%) and the Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities (15.7% to 16.9%).

Two large agencies (3,000 employees or more) experienced a decline of 1% or more in incident rate from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010: the Department of Corrections (15.2% to 12.8%) and the Office of Parks and Recreation (11.3% to 10.3%).

**Table 2A** and **Table 2B** list the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies' workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivisions **(6b)**, and **(6c)**. The 2009/2010 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2009 and March 31, 2010 and reported through June 30, 2010. The 2007/2008 and 2008/2009 claims experience is the same data reported in last year's report.

Although the number of employees decreased by 2.5%, the number of lost time incidents increased by 2% from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010. The lost work days increased 4.6% from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010. Both the lost time rate and lost time case rate also increased from the previous fiscal year.

Consistent with the increase in both the number of lost time incidents and lost work days, most of the large agencies (3,000 employees or more) had substantial increases in one or both of these categories including: the Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities, Office of Children & Family Services, and Office of Mental Health. Conversely, State Universities of New York, Department of Transportation and Office of Parks and Recreation experienced a substantial decrease in lost time from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010.

**Table 3** lists the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies and contains the workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivisions (6d) and (6e). The claims experience in Table 3 was provided by the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF). The 2009/2010 claims experience includes incidents occurring between April 1, 2009 and March 31, 2010 and paid through June 30, 2010. The 2007/2008 and 2008/2009 claims experience is the same data reported in last year's report.

Under New York State Workers' Compensation Law, employees who are disabled due to a workers' compensation incident are entitled to a wage replacement for lost salary and medical benefits related to the incident. The wage component is equal to two-thirds of the employee's average weekly wage not to exceed a maximum established under the Workers' Compensation Law. The statutory maximum was \$400 from April 1, 2007 to June 30, 2007. It increased to \$500 on July 1, 2007, \$550 on July 1, 2008, and \$600 on July 1, 2009. The data in Table 3 does not include supplemental wage replacement payment benefits as these amounts are paid by individual agencies and are not reflected in data maintained by the NYSIF. Under the medical component, all medical treatments, including doctor treatments, hospital or clinic charges, imaging services and diagnostic testing, prescription medication, and other related medical services, are paid in full based on a fee schedule contained in the Workers' Compensation Law.

All wage replacements and medical treatments are initially reviewed by the State Insurance Fund and receive final review from the Workers' Compensation Board. Both the compensation costs and the medical costs are paid by the State Insurance Fund under the provisions of the workers' compensation insurance policy between New York State and the State Insurance Fund.

There was an increase in both total compensation and medical costs from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010. Total compensation cost increased from \$22,770,590 to \$25,293,052, slightly over 11% which is largely attributable to the increase in the statutory maximum for supplemental wage replacement benefits, as well as the increased number of total lost work days (Table 2B, page 34). Total medical cost increased from \$20,636,439 to \$22,657,840, nearly 10%. The increase is a function of medical/hospital trend and utilization mix, which are consistent with national trends. Although total medical costs increased, prescription drug costs decreased by 11% as a result of NYSIF's implementation of a pharmacy network in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter 2008. All the large agencies (3,000 employees or more) experienced increases in one or both categories except for the State Universities of New York, Department of Health, and Office of Parks and Recreation which had decreases in compensation and medical costs from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010.

## **Tables 4A, 4B, 4C: Most Frequent Types of Injuries, Accident Causes, and Body Parts Injured: Fiscal Years 2009/2010, 2008/2009, 2007/2008**

In the next series of tables, details are provided on the most frequent types of injuries (Table 4A), accident causes (Table 4B), and body parts injured (Table 4C) as specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (6f). The data in all three tables was derived from the Accident Reporting System (ARS) for all incidents that resulted in a workers' compensation claims during Fiscal Years 2009/2010, 2008/2009, and 2007/2008.

The *Occupational Injury and Illness Classification Manual* issued by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics was used to capture the details on the types of injuries, accident causes, and body parts injured. This manual is the standard classification system used to classify occupational injuries and illnesses. Coding occupational injuries/illnesses is dependent upon the description provided by the individual reporting the incident, the classification system being used, and the codes selected by the individual entering the information. Certain categories may be viewed as similar, but were reported separately in order to retain the integrity of the original reporting entity; for example in Table 4B (page 48) *Falls, Fall to the Floor, Fall Down Stairs* and *Fall On Same Level* were reported as separate categories.

**Table 4A**, the Most Frequent Types of Injuries includes injury types in which the inclusion criteria accounted for nearly 97% of all incidents. Similar to the prior years, four injury type categories accounted for nearly two-thirds of all incidents in FY 2009/2010: soreness, pain, excluding the back (34.5%); sprains, strains, tears (19.0%); bruises, contusions (6.7%); and back pain, hurt back (6.4%).

The most frequent incident causes are detailed in **Table 4B**. The three most frequent incident causes for all three fiscal years were bodily reaction and exertion; a fall to the floor, walkway, or other surface; and overexertion in lifting. In FY 2009/2010, the number of falls declined and it is now the number two incident cause.

The body parts most frequently injured are listed in **Table 4C** and account for slightly over 97% of all incidents. In all three years, three body parts represented over one-third of the body parts injured: the back, including spine, and spinal cord; knee(s); and the shoulder, including clavicle and scapula.

**Table 5** contains the job titles with incident rates greater than 25% above the average for all employees in FY 2009/2010 as per *Chapter 171*, subdivision (6g). The average incident rate for all employees was 9.9% as reported in Table 1. The selected titles listed in Table 5 had an incident rate of 12.4% or greater and a minimum of 25 incidents to be included in the table.

Security Hospital Treatment Assistant had an incident rate of 76.2% in FY 2009/2010, similar to FY 2008/2009. Youth Division Aide 4, Security Hospital Senior Treatment Assistant, Secure Care Treatment Aide 1, and Developmental Disabilities Secure Care Treatment Aide 2 and Trainee had substantial increases (5 percentage points or greater) in incident rates from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010.

Conversely, three titles experienced substantial decreases in incident rates (5 percentage points or greater) from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010 including: Youth Division Aide 2, Bridge Repair Mechanic, and Carpenter.

Two titles that were not included in the previous report were added to this year's report: Highway Maintenance Supervisor 1 and Parks & Recreation Aide 2. The titles: Laborer, Senior Recreation Therapist, Food Service Worker 2, Correction Officer Trainee, and Cook were excluded from this year's report since their incident rates were below 12.4%.

**Table 7** contains selected Executive Branch New York State negotiating units workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision **(6i)**. The information in Table 7 was provided by the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF) from the claims for the respective fiscal years as detailed in the footnotes of the table. The totals for Security Services Unit Non-Arbitration, Agency Law Enforcement Services, Security Supervisors Unit, and Security Supervisors Unit Non-Arbitration were added this year for a broader representation of the negotiating units.

Slight increases in the incident rate from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010 were noted in the Institutional Services Unit (23.3% to 23.8%), Security Services Unit (16.1% to 16.3%) and Professional, Scientific & Technical Services Unit (3.9% to 4.1%). Conversely, there was a slight decrease in the incident rates from the previous fiscal year for the Administrative Services Unit (3.3% to 3.2%). The incident rate remained the same for the Operational Services Unit from the previous fiscal year.

# Summary of Findings and Recommendations

## Findings

Highlights are presented below for NYS Executive Branch agency workers' compensation incidents for classified employees incurred in Fiscal Years (FY) 2009/2010, 2008/2009 and 2007/2008. As this is the third report, only three years of data are available.

- There were 15,643 work related claims in FY 2009/2010 compared to 15,916 claims in FY 2008/2009 and 15,846 claims in FY 2007/2008 (Table 1, page 15).
- The overall workers' compensation incident rate was 9.9% in both FY 2009/2010 and FY 2008/2009 compared to 9.6% in FY 2007/2008 (Table 1, page 15).
- The lost time incident rate increased slightly in FY 2009/2010 to 2.9% from 2.8% in FY 2008/2009 (Table 2A, page 25)
- Slightly over 29% of workers' compensation incidents in FY 2009/2010 resulted in lost time. There were 4,564 lost time incidents resulting in 281,295 lost work days in FY 2009/2010. Both the number of lost time incidents and number of lost work days have increased in the past two years (Table 2B, page 34).
- There was an increase in both total compensation and medical costs from FY 2008/2009 to FY 2009/2010. Total compensation cost increased from \$22,770,590 to \$25,293,052, slightly over 11%. Total medical cost increased from \$20,636,439 to \$22,657,840, nearly 10%. (Table 3, page 44).
- Soreness and pain - excluding the back accounted for approximately one-third of all types of injuries in FY 2009/2010, FY 2008/2009, and FY 2008/2007. Sprains, strains, tears and bruises, contusions were the next most frequent types of injuries in the three fiscal years reported (Table 4A, page 46).
- The leading incident causes in all three fiscal years reported were: falls, bodily reaction and exertion, and overexertion in lifting (Table 4B, page 48).
- The top three body parts injured in all three fiscal years were: the back, knee, and shoulder (Table 4C, page 52).
- For the third year in a row, the three job titles with the highest number of incidents were: Correction Officer, Developmental Aide, and Mental Health Therapy Aide. Security Hospital Treatment Assistant had the highest incident rate in the three fiscal years reported (Table 5, page 55).
- The two agencies with 500 or more employees with the highest incident rates in FY 2009/2010 were Kingsboro Psychiatric Center and Bronx Psychiatric Center. (Table 6, page 58).
- In the FY 2009/2010, FY 2008/2009 and FY 2007/2008, the Administrative Services Unit had the lowest incident rate, and the Institutional Services Unit had the highest incident rate (Table 7, page 62).

## **Recommendations**

The following recommendations regarding the prevention of injury and illnesses and the reduction of costs due to these cases were prepared in consultation with the Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) and the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF).

- **Increase Agency Awareness** – Ensure that workers' compensation awareness is a top priority in every State agency. Each agency should set realistic goals on injury prevention and clearly define who is responsible for interacting with employees when they have suffered a work-related disability. Each agency should clearly communicate workers' compensation policies so both the employees and managers have a clear understanding of the process.
- **Injury Prevention/Reduction Plans** – Each agency should develop and regularly update an injury prevention/reduction plan that is tailored to the particular type of work done at the agency. Detailed data on workers' compensation accidents is available to each agency through the Accident Reporting System, including the physical location where incidents occurred, job titles specific to an agency and detailed case records which describe how incidents occurred. Individual agencies are encouraged to analyze their workers' compensation experience using the tools available in the Accident Reporting System and use it to develop injury prevention/reduction plans.
- **Convene a Workers' Compensation Taskforce** – A Workers' Compensation Taskforce should be convened to identify process improvements and best practices in managing workers' compensation accidents. The taskforce should consist of Human Resources practitioners from a variety of agencies (institutional, small, medium, large); the Department of Civil Service; the Governor's Office of Employee Relations; the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF); and the Workers' Compensation Board (WCB)



## CHAPTER 171

AN ACT to amend the civil service law, in relation to requiring annual reports about employee accident rates and costs in state agencies

Became a law July 3, 2007, with the approval of the Governor.  
Passed by a majority vote, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 7 of the civil service law is amended by adding a new subdivision 6 to read as follows:

6. The president of the commission shall prepare an annual report describing occupational injuries, illnesses, and workers' compensation experience for all state agencies as defined by subdivision three of section two-a of the state finance law. Such report shall be published no later than September thirtieth of each year, beginning in two thousand eight, and shall report information on the basis of the last completed state fiscal year. In subsequent years, the report shall include comparative data for up to five prior fiscal years if such data is available. The report shall be delivered to the governor, the legislature and to any labor organization that represents state agency employees and shall be available to the public. The contents of the report shall include the following information for each state agency, broken down by institutions and facilities as was done in the report previously published by the department entitled "Occupational Accidents and Workers' Compensation Experience for NYS Government Employees" published from nineteen hundred eighty-seven to nineteen hundred ninety-two:

(a) the total number of employees, the number of work-related accidents and the rate of work-related injuries and illnesses;

(b) the number of lost work time injuries and illnesses and the rate of lost work time cases;

(c) the number of days of lost work time and the number and rate of lost full time employees;

(d) the cost to the state of lost work time due to work-related cases;

(e) the cost to the state of medical expenses due to work-related injuries and illnesses;

(f) a description of the types of injuries, the number of injuries and illnesses of each type and the most common causes of those cases, and the body part injured;

(g) a list of the job titles with work-related injury and illness rates that are more than twenty-five percent above the average for all state agencies;

(h) a list of the state agencies with work-related injury and illness rates that are more than twenty-five percent above the average for all state agencies;

(i) work-related injury and illness rates for all state agencies by collective bargaining units; and

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(j) a summary of findings and recommendations prepared in consultation with the workers' compensation board and the state insurance fund for state agencies regarding the prevention of injury and illnesses and the reduction of costs due to these cases.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
