Introduction

Background

This is the Department of Civil Service's second annual report, "New York State Government Employees' Workers' Compensation Claims." The highlight of the report is that it is the first report to include workers' compensation experience from two fiscal years (2008/2009 and 2007/2008).

Section 7 of the Civil Service Law was amended in Chapter 171 of the Laws of 2007 (Appendix A of this report) to require that the President of the Civil Service Commission prepare an annual report describing occupational injuries, illnesses and workers' compensation claims in Executive Branch state agencies. The report is required to be published by September thirtieth each year and include worker's compensation data based on the last completed fiscal year. In subsequent years, the report shall include comparative data for up to five fiscal years. A similar report was published by the Department of Civil Service from 1986 through 1992.

The report format follows the sections specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007. Table 2 consolidates subdivisions (**6b**) and (**6c**) of the legislation and Table 3 consolidates subdivisions (**6d**) and (**6e**) of the legislation.

The Department of Civil Service, Employee Benefits Division, is responsible for overseeing the workers' compensation insurance policy between New York State and the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF). Part of this responsibility includes the reporting and monitoring of workers' compensation experience through the Accident Reporting System (ARS) and a summary of workers' compensation claims experience provided by the NYSIF. Workers' compensation data for this report are obtained from both ARS and NYSIF. Employee population data are obtained from the Department of Civil Service New York State Electronic Personnel System (NYSTEP).

As previously noted, workers' compensation data was obtained from two different databases: NYSIF and ARS. Use of the two databases was necessitated by the reporting requirements specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007. Neither database contained a complete picture of the information required for this report. As a result, there is a slight difference in the number of cases contained in each database. The difference is due to cases being reported to NYSIF but not to ARS as a result of manual reporting for employees not eligible for an ARS report and the use of "small claims" by NYSIF in which an incident results in only one medical bill and no lost time and is not indexed by the Workers' Compensation Board. The small claim often does not result in an incident report being submitted through ARS.

Information in this report is presented in a summary manner at a summary level. New York State agency Human Resources and Health and Safety staff are encouraged to use the reporting capabilities of the ARS, which will allow for much greater detail of the information presented in this report, as well as many other workers' compensation incident details.

Explanatory Notes

The report *includes* selected Executive branch agencies' Classified Service employees consistent with subdivision three of section two-a of the State Finance Law. The report *excludes* the Judicial and Legislative branches, as well as the Unclassified Service and Authorities, as the Department of Civil Service does not maintain employee data on these groups.

Information in this report is based on New York State workers' compensation claims filed by the included employees. Although the reporting period is by fiscal year 2008/2009 (April 1, 2008 through March 31, 2009) and 2007/2008 (April 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008), claims for FY 2008/2009 were reviewed until July 1, 2009 and claims for FY 2007/2008 were reviewed until July 1, 2008 to allow for late reporting and for the data to be captured in which workers' compensation determinations were made after the end of the fiscal year.

Incident data included in this report are for work related incidents, either injuries or occupational illnesses that were reported to the Workers' Compensation Board and the State Insurance Fund as required by the New York State Workers' Compensation Law. The Law requires reporting of all incidents that result in either: one or more lost work days beyond the date of the incident or medical treatment beyond first aid or two or more first aid treatments. There are many incidents that do not reach the level of the reporting criteria under the Workers' Compensation Law.

Executive Summary

Highlights are presented below for NYS Executive Branch agency workers' compensation incidents for classified employees incurred in Fiscal Years 2008/2009 and 2007/2008. As this is the second report, only two years of data are available.

- There were 15,916 work related claims in FY 2008/2009 compared to 15,846 claims in FY 2007/2008 (Table 1, page 7).
- The overall workers' compensation incident rate was 9.9% in FY 2008/2009 and 9.6% in FY 2007/2008 (Table 1, page 7).
- Slightly over 25% of workers' compensation incidents resulted in lost time. There were 4,478 lost time incidents resulting in 268,896 lost work days in FY 2008/2009 compared with 4,271 lost time incidents resulting in 247,975 lost work days in FY 2007/2008 (Table 2, page 17).
- There was a substantial increase in both total compensation and medical costs from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009. Total compensation cost increased from \$18,690,687 to \$22,770,590, nearly 22%. Total medical cost increased from \$19,690,167 to \$20,636,439, nearly 5%. (Table 3, page 27).
- Soreness and pain excluding the back accounted for nearly one-third of all types of injuries in both FY 2008/2009 and FY 2007/2008. Sprains, strains, tears, and bruises and contusions were the next most frequent types of injuries in both years (Table 4A, page 37).
- The leading incident causes in both fiscal years were: falls, bodily reaction and exertion, and overexertion in lifting (Table 4B, page 39).
- The top three body parts injured in both years were: the back, knee, and shoulder (Table 4C, page 42).
- In FY 2008/2009 as in FY 2007/2008 the three job titles with the highest number of incidents were: Correction Officer, Developmental Aide, and Mental Health Therapy Aide. Security hospital Treatment Assistant had the highest incident rate in both fiscal years (Table 5, page 46).
- The two agencies with 500 or more employees with the highest incident rates were Mid-Hudson Psychiatric Center and Coxsackie Correctional Facility in both FY 2008/2009 and FY 2007/2008. Bronx Psychiatric Center had one of the highest accident rates for agencies with 500 or more employees in FY 2008/2009 (Table 6, page 49).
- In both FY 2008/2009 and FY 2007/2008 the Administrative Services Unit had the lowest incident rate, and the Institutional Services Unit had the highest incident rate (Table 7, page 53).

Table 1: Workers' Compensation Incident RatesSelected New York State Agencies:Fiscal Years 2007/2008 and 2008/2009

Table 1 lists the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies' workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (**6a**). The information in Table 1 was provided by the New York State Insurance Fund. The 2008/2009 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2008 and March 31, 2009 and reported through June 30, 2009. The 2007/2008 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2008 and is the same data reported in last year's report.

There were a total of 15,916 workers' compensation incidents reported and an incident rate of 9.9% in FY 2008/2009 compared to 15,846 incidents and an incident rate of 9.6% in FY 2007/2008.

A substantial increase in incident rate from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009 was noted at the Office of Children and Family Services (14.7% to 19.6%). Other large agencies that also experienced an increase in incident rate were: the Department of Correctional Services (13.2% to 15.2%) and the Office of Mental Health (13.9% to 16.8%).

Three large agencies experienced a notable decline in incident rate from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009: the Office of General Services (4.3% to 3.2%), the Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities (16.6% to 15.7%), and the State University of New York (12.0% to 11.0%).

Table 2 lists the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies' workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivisions (**6b**), and (**6c**). The 2008/2009 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2008 and March 31, 2009 and reported through June 30, 2009. The 2007/2008 claims experience includes accidents occurring between April 1, 2007 and March 31, 2008 and reported through June 30, 2008 and is the same data reported in last year's report.

The total number of lost time incidents increased nearly 5% and the lost work days increased over 8% from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009. Both the lost time rate and lost time case rate also increased slightly from the previous fiscal year.

Consistent with the increase in both the number of lost time incidents and lost work days, most of the large agencies had substantial increases in one or both of these categories including: Office of Children & Family Services, Department of Correctional Services, Department of Health, Office of Mental Health, Office of Parks and Recreation, State University of New York, and Department of Transportation. Conversely, the Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities experienced a substantial decrease in lost time from FY 2007/2008 to 2008/2009.

Table 3 lists the selected Executive Branch New York State agencies and contains the workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivisions (**6d**) *and* (**6e**). The claims experience in Table 3 was provided by the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF). The 2008/2009 claims experience includes incidents occurring between April 1, 2008 and March 31, 2009 and paid through June 30, 2009. The 2007/2008 claims experience includes incidents occurring between April 1, 2008 and paid through June 30, 2008.

Under New York State Workers' Compensation Law, employees who are disabled due to a workers' compensation incident are entitled to a wage replacement for lost salary and medical benefits related to the incident. The wage component is equal to two-thirds of the employee's average weekly wage not to exceed a maximum established under the Workers' Compensation Law. During Fiscal year 2007/2008, the statutory maximum was \$400 from April 1 to June 30, and was raised to \$500 from July 1 to June 30. As of July 1, 2008, the maximum is \$550 per week. The data in Table 3 does not include supplemental wage replacement payment benefits as these amounts are paid by individual agencies and are not reflected in data maintained by the NYSIF. Under the medical component, all medical treatments, including doctor treatments, hospital or clinic charges, imaging services and diagnostic testing, prescription medication, and other related medical service, are paid in full based on a fee schedule contained in the Workers' Compensation Law.

All wage replacements and medical treatments are initially reviewed by the State Insurance Fund and receive final review from the Workers' Compensation Board. Both the compensation costs and the medical costs are paid by the State Insurance Fund under the provisions of the workers' compensation insurance policy between New York State and the State Insurance Fund.

There was a substantial increase in both total compensation and medical costs from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009. Total compensation cost increased from \$18,690,687 to \$22,770,590, nearly 22%. Total medical cost increased from \$19,690,167 to \$20,636,439, nearly 5%. All the large agencies experienced similar increases except for Office of Mental Retardation and Developmental Disabilities and Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation which both had slight decreases in medical costs from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009.

Tables 4A, 4B, 4C: Most Frequent Types of Injuries, Accident Causes, and Body Parts Injured: Fiscal Years 2007/2008 and 2008/2009

In the next series of tables, details are provided on the most frequent types of injuries (Table 4A), accident causes (Table 4B), and body parts injured (Table 4C) as specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (**6f**). The data in all three tables was derived from the Accident Reporting System (ARS) for all incidents that resulted in a workers' compensation claims during Fiscal Years 2008/2009 and 2007/2008.

The Occupational Injury and Illness Classification Manual issued by the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics was used to capture the details on the types of injuries, accident causes, and body parts injured. This manual is the standard classification system used to classify occupational injuries and illnesses. Coding occupational injuries/illnesses is dependent upon the description provided by the individual reporting the incident, the classification system being used, and the codes selected by the individual entering the information. As a result of this variability in coding, there is overlap noted in the descriptions of all three of the following tables. However, this overlap was maintained rather than consolidated in order to preserve the original integrity of the codes that were used and to account for small differences between these codes.

Table 4A, the Most Frequent Types of Injuries includes injury types in which a minimum of eight of a specific category were reported. These inclusion criteria accounted for nearly 97% of all incidents. Similar to the prior year, four injury type categories accounted for nearly two-thirds of all incidents in FY 2008/2009: soreness, pain, excluding the back (33.2%); sprains, strains, tears (16.9%); bruises, contusions (7.4%); and back pain, hurt back (7.3%).

The most frequent incident causes are detailed in **Table 4B**. The three most frequent incident causes in both FY 2008/2009 and FY 2007/2008 were a fall to the floor, walkway, or other surface; bodily reaction and exertion; and overexertion in lifting.

The body parts most frequently injured are listed in **Table 4C** and account for nearly 99% of all incidents. Three body parts represented over one-third of the body parts injured: the back, including spine, and spinal cord; knee(s); and the shoulder, including clavicle and scapula.

Table 5 contains the job titles with incident rates greater than 25% above the average for all employees in FY 2008/2009 as per *Chapter 171*, subdivision (**6g**). The average incident rate for all employees was 9.9% as reported in Table 1. The selected titles listed in Table 5 had an incident rate of 12.4% or greater and a minimum of 30 incidents to be included in the table.

Security Hospital Treatment Assistant had an incident rate of 76.5% in FY 2008/2009, a little over 6% higher than in FY 2007/2008. Security Hospital Senior Treatment Assistant, Youth Division Aide 3, Youth Division Aide 4, Mental Health Therapy Aide Trainee, Mental Health Therapy Aide, and Youth Division Aide 2 also had substantial increases (5% or greater) in incident rates from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009.

Conversely, three titles experienced substantial decreases in incident rates (5% or greater) from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009 including: Developmental Disabilities Secure Care Treatment Aide Trainee, Grounds Worker, and Hospital Attendant 1.

Two titles that were not included in the previous report were added to this year's report: Nurse 2 Psychiatric and Senior Recreation Therapist. The titles: Motor Vehicle Operator; Motor Equipment Maintenance Supervisor 1; University Police Officer 1; Environmental Officer; and Highway Maintenance Supervisor 1 were excluded from this year's report since their incident rates were below 12.4%.

Subdivision (**6h**) of *Chapter 171* specifies that the workers' compensation annual report provide a list of state agencies with work related injury and illness rates that are more than twenty-five percent above the average incident rate for all state agencies. The average incident rate for all employees was 9.9% as reported in Table 1. The agencies listed in **Table 6** had an incident rate of 12.4% or greater in FY 2008/2009. The reader is referred to Table 1 for a listing of all state agencies and their respective incident rates.

Table 7 contains selected Executive Branch New York State negotiating units workers' compensation details specified in *Chapter 171* of the Laws of 2007, subdivision (**6i**). The information in Table 7 was provided by the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF) from the claims for the respective fiscal years as detailed in the footnotes of the table.

Slight increases in the incident rate from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009 were noted in the Institutional Services Unit (22.1% to 23.3%) and Professional, Scientific & Technical Services Unit (3.6% to 3.9%). Conversely, there were slight decreases in the incident rates from the previous fiscal year in the Administrative Services Unit (3.4% to 3.3%), Operational Services Unit (14.3% to 13.3%), and the Security Services Unit (16.9% to 16.1%).

Summary of Findings and Recommendations

Findings

- There were 15,916 work related claims in FY 2008/2009 compared to 15,846 claims in FY 2007/2008 (Table 1, page 7).
- The overall workers' compensation incident rate was 9.9% in FY 2008/2009 and 9.6% in FY 2007/2008 (Table 1, page 7).
- Slightly over 25% of workers' compensation incidents resulted in lost time. There were 4,478 lost time incidents resulting in 268,896 lost work days in FY 2008/2009 compared with 4,271 lost time incidents resulting in 247,975 lost work days in FY 2007/2008 (Table 2, page 17).
- There was a substantial increase in both total compensation and medical costs from FY 2007/2008 to FY 2008/2009. Total compensation costs increased from \$18,690,687 to \$22,770,590, nearly 22%. Total medical costs increased from \$19,690,167 to \$20,636,439, nearly 5%. (Table 3, page 27).
- Soreness and pain excluding the back accounted for nearly one-third of all types of injuries in both FY 2008/2009 and FY 2007/2008. Sprains, strains, tears, and bruises and contusions were the next most frequent types of injuries in both years (Table 4A, page 37).
- The leading incident causes in both fiscal years were: falls, bodily reaction and exertion, and overexertion in lifting (Table 4B, page 39).
- The top three body parts injured in both years were: the back, knee, and shoulder (Table 4C, page 42).
- In FY 2008/2009 as in FY 2007/2008 the three job titles with the highest number of incidents were: Correction Officer, Developmental Aide, and Mental Health Therapy Aide. Security Hospital Treatment Assistant had the highest incident rate in both fiscal years (Table 5, page 46).
- The two agencies with 500 or more employees with the highest incident rates were Mid-Hudson Psychiatric Center and Coxsackie Correctional Facility in both FY 2008/2009 and FY 2007/2008. Bronx Psychiatric Center had one of the highest accident rates for agencies with 500 or more employees in FY 2008/2009 (Table 6, page 49).
- In both FY 2008/2009 and FY 2007/2008 the Administrative Services Unit had the lowest incident rate and the Institutional Services Unit had the highest incident rate (Table 7, page 53).

Recommendations

The following recommendations regarding the prevention of injury and illnesses and the reduction of costs due to these cases were prepared in consultation with the Workers' Compensation Board (WCB) and the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF).

- The data presented in the 2008-2009 annual report is on a summary basis. Detailed information and reporting is available to each agency through the Accident Reporting System, including the physical location where incidents occurred, job titles specific to an agency and detailed case records which describe how incidents occurred. Individual agencies are encouraged to analyze their workers' compensation experience using the tools available in the Accident Reporting System and share this data with their Health and Safety Committee to help prevent future injury and illness.
- In 2009, the WCB introduced a revised C-2, "Employer's Report of Work Related Injury/Illness" and a "Claimant Information Packet." Both items will help in the processing of workers' compensation claims and delivery of benefits as well as assisting injured employees in becoming better educated consumers of the workers' compensation procedures and benefits. We recommend that State Agency personnel officers ensure that all claimants have easy access to a Claimant Information Packet. An electronic version is located on the Department's website: www.cs.state.ny.us/ebdonline.
- The NYSIF indicated that subsequent to last year's report NYSIF and Civil Service presented forums across the state in Albany, Binghamton, Syracuse, Buffalo and Rochester. These forums, which had minimal associated costs, offer an opportunity for NYSIF staff to discuss best practices in the effort to return injured workers' to their jobs. We recommend that combined NYSIF/DCS forums be scheduled again for fiscal year 2009/2010 and that NYSIF, DCS and State Agency personnel officers continue to work collaboratively to ensure all claimants receive prompt medical care so they can return to work as expeditiously as possible.

CHAPTER 171

AN ACT to amend the civil service law, in relation to requiring annual reports about employee accident rates and costs in state agencies

Became a law July 3, 2007, with the approval of the Governor. Passed by a majority vote, three-fifths being present.

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 7 of the civil service law is amended by adding a new subdivision 6 to read as follows:

6. The president of the commission shall prepare an annual report describing occupational injuries, illnesses, and workers' compensation experience for all state agencies as defined by subdivision three of section two-a of the state finance law. Such report shall be published no later than September thirtieth of each year, beginning in two thousand eight, and shall report information on the basis of the last completed state fiscal year. In subsequent years, the report shall include comparative data for up to five prior fiscal years if such data available. The report shall be delivered to the governor, the legislature and to any labor organization that represents state agency employees and shall be available to the public. The contents of the report shall include the following information for each state agency, broken down by institutions and facilities as was done in the report previously published by the department entitled "Occupational Accidents and Workers' Compensation Experience for NYS Government Employees" published from nineteen hundred eighty-seven to nineteen hundred ninety-two:

(a) the total number of employees, the number of work-related accidents and the rate of work-related injuries and illnesses;

(b) the number of lost work time injuries and illnesses and the rate of lost work time cases;

(c) the number of days of lost work time and the number and rate of lost full time employees;

(d) the cost to the state of lost work time due to work-related cases;

(e) the cost to the state of medical expenses due to work-related injuries and illnesses;

(f) a description of the types of injuries, the number of injuries and illnesses of each type and the most common causes of those cases, and the body part injured;

(g) a list of the job titles with work-related injury and illness rates that are more than twenty-five percent above the average for all state agencies;

(h) a list of the state agencies with work-related injury and illness rates that are more than twenty-five percent above the average for all state agencies;

(i) work-related injury and illness rates for all state agencies by collective bargaining units; and

(j) a summary of findings and recommendations prepared in consultation with the workers' compensation board and the state insurance fund for state agencies regarding the prevention of injury and illnesses and the reduction of costs due to these cases.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
