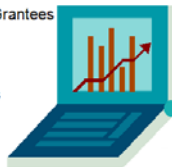
## Mission of CSAT-SAMHSA

- Improve service delivery

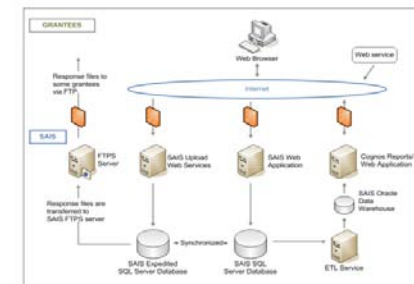
