





Weaving an Islander Network for Cancer Awareness, Research & Training (WINCART)

- ✓ Five year U01 center to increase cancer education, research and training for Pacific Islanders (PIs) in Southern California
- ✓ Geographic area: Los Angeles, Orange, San Diego, San Bernardino, and Riverside counties
- ✓ Community-university collaboration
 - 10 community-based organization partners serving the Chamorro, Marshallese, Native Hawaiian, Samoan and Tongan communities
 - 6 university partners




Review & Pretesting Education Materials

- Kreuter's guidelines for cultural tailoring via peripheral, evidential, sociocultural, linguistic, and constituent involving elements.
- ✓ Reading level at 6th grade based upon SMOG analysis.
- ✓ In-language focus groups with adult Pacific Islanders (PIs) age 50+ years.
 - Understandability/readability of written materials and surveys
 - Acceptability of colors, fonts, images
 - Clarity of educational messages
 - Appropriateness of sensitive information
 - Suggestions for improvement

Education & Evaluation Design

- ☐ Lay-leader led education sessions with small groups of adult PI age 50+ years.
- Quasi-experimental design to evaluate the tailored materials compared to a non-tailored handout of information (based upon the CIS' "What you need to know"/WYNTYK)
 - ☐ Pros/cons of quasi vs. experimental design
- ☐ Self-administered pre- and post-workshop surveys to assess changes in knowledge, beliefs and intentions





Toolkit Dissemination

- Created a toolkit of materials containing all educational and evaluation materials
- Partnership between WINCART and St. Joseph's Hospital in Orange to expand CRC education and follow-up via Pacific Islander lay navigators
