- 4) Are there other Native Hawaiian organizations and/or agencies that you work with? If so, please explain the capacity and/or projects that you have worked with these partner organizations or agencies, or how you continue to work with them.
- 5) Are there other Native Hawaiian organizations and/or agencies that you would like to work with in the future?
- 6) Does your organization have a strategic plan or conceptual framework? If yes, would it be possible to review that plan or framework?

Attitudes/Beliefs, Barriers

- 1) How would you describe an ideal relationship with other Native Hawaiian (health) organizations'/agencies' towards accomplishing a common goal?
- 2) How would working together with other Native Hawaiian (health) organizations/agencies affect the process towards achieving a common goal?
- 3) What prohibits your organization/agency from working collaboratively with other Native Hawaiian (health) organizations/agencies?
- 4) Is there a tool that could assist in focusing efforts and goals amongst all Native Hawaiian (health) organizations/agencies?
