How We Got Here

- The Community Health Assessment (CHA) team generated a **list of the top health and quality of life issues** in Chatham County based on 695 Community Opinion Surveys and 41 key informant interviews.
- Fact sheets were assembled for each of the 15 issues to help determine feasibility of addressing the issue.
- Secondary data was collected for each of the 15 issues to help determine the magnitude and severity of the problem.
- A **prioritization scoring worksheet** was drafted based on input from the Chatham County CHA steering team as well as theory and practice-based resources for issue prioritization.
- Members of the CHA Steering Team tested the process for utilizing the score sheet.

Prevalence and Compared to NC Scores

Prevalence

- 25% or more receives a 9 or 10
- 10% through 24.9% receives a 7 or 8
- 1% through 9.9% receives a 5 or 6
- .1% through .9% receives a 3 or 4
- .01% through .09% receives a 1 or 2
- Less than .01% (1/10,000) receives a 0

Compared to NC

- 10% or more higher receives a 9 or 10
- 9.9% through 8% higher receives a 7 or 8
- 7.9% through 5% higher receives a 5 or 6
- 4.9% through 2% higher receives a 3 or 4
- 1.9% higher through .5% higher receives a 1 or 2
- .4% or less percent higher receives a 0
- Lower than the state rate receives a 0

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Health Disparity Column

Give the issue a score between 1 and 10. Use the questions below to help you arrive at a **single feasibility score**. A one is not at all feasible within the next four years and a 10 is very feasible within the next four years from a community standpoint.

Please note, when scores are tallied, the feasibility score will be given a weight X 5.

- Is the disparity affecting certain groups more than others?
- What is the size of the disparity?

Feasibility (Use the answers to these questions for the basis of your score.)

- What is the extent of **public concern**?
- Are there **resources available** (leadership, staff, skill sets, budget, existing community resources)?
- Are effective multi-level public health **strategies** available to address the issue?
- What is the **size of the gap** between existing community resources and the issue? In other words, do we have the resources to implement multi-level public health strategies?
- What are some of the **challenges** in addressing this issue?
