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Providers' Acceptance Factors and their Perceived Barriers to Electronic Health Record (EHR) Adoption

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The following provides an outline of my research study:

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- 2. This study explored acceptance factors and barriers associated with providers' intention to adopt EHR by provider types (physicians and advanced practice providers).
- 3. Physicians (*n*=24) and advanced practice providers (*n*=20) employed in acute care `settings at a community healthcare system participated in the study.
- 4. The participants in this study indicated that perceived management support, provider involvement, and adequate training were facilitators. Perceived lack of usefulness and provider autonomy were barriers (p<0.01).
- 5. Advanced practice providers found EHR marginally easier to use, but were less inclined to accept EHR in clinical practice compared to physicians.
- 6. Increasing Age was negatively correlated with EHR adoption for physicians only (r=-.476, p<.05).
