Competition Background

- 1st Interdisciplinary Case Competition held March 2013.
- 17 students from 7 units (3 teams) participated:
 - 1. Anthropology
 - 2. Communication Sciences & Disorders
 - 3. Health Promotion
 - 4. Law
 - 5. Public Health
 - 6. Public & Non-Profit Administration
 - 7. Social Work



Competition Background

- 4 hour kick-off session
- Training on social determinants of health and group process/teamwork
- Focus of case: addressing child obesity in Memphis
- Six weeks to work together and prepare case



Competition Background

- 20 minute presentations & 5 minutes for Q&A
- Panel of judges:
 - Two directors of health-oriented non-profits
 - Former medical school dean
- Awards:
 - -\$250/\$100/\$50 ea. for $1^{st}/2^{nd}/3^{rd}$ place
 - Recognition as "Interdisciplinary Case Competition Scholar" (for resume/CV)



Competition Evaluation

- Post-competition evaluation sent to participating students (n=17)
- On-line survey delivered via Qualtrics
- Quantitative & qualitative questions on experiences and suggested improvements
- Focus on Interprofessional Competencies adapted from Core Competences for Interprofessional Collaborative Practice¹





Time Involved


• Time Spent: avg. (min/max)


- Individual: 11.4 hours (2, 30)


- Team: 15.2 hours (7, 25)
