This chart outlines per learner cost comparisons, **if** TRAIN did charge per learner.


Returns on Investment

The **Kansas** Department of Health and Environment, partnered with the Department of Preventine Medicine and Public Health, University of Kansas School of Medicine-Wichita, conducted a study determining the cost savings for a public health learner taking online training through TRAIN as opposed to a classroom course.

Between 2005 and 2012, Kansas showed **\$14 million** in savings.

The **Kentucky** Department for Public Health documented savings in excess of **\$21.75 million** between 2007 and 2009.

TRAIN Builds Competence

Over 2.6 million courses have been completed through TRAIN. Over 43% of courses completed included Core Competencies for Public Health Professionals, a figure that also reflects 33% of all courses initially registered for.
