<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Standardize services across clinics and sustain them • No wrong door – patients can access family planning, including LARC, no matter where they seek care in our health system (community, school-based or public health clinics) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Access to 340B priced LARC as a Title X provider • Nurse Practitioner on-site certified for contraceptive implant trainings • Support from leadership – OBGYN, Pediatrics, Family Medicine • Health Educators at some, not all, clinics who have time and skill set to counsel on all methods, including LARC
