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

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Caring for Our Children: Environmental Health in Early Care and Education

Why focus on children's environmental health?

Children are not just "little adults".

- · They crawl on the floor, put things in their mouths, and have faster respiratory rates.
- · All of their systems (nervous, reproductive, hormonal) are still growing and developing.

Why focus on early care and education?

- · Every day, approximately 11 million children under the age of 5 in the U.S. attend early care and education programs;
- An average of 36 hours per week is spent in these programs.





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Caring for Our Children: Environmental Health in Early Care and Education

The Purpose

- Represents best practices determined by research or expert consensus that will ensure an environmentally-healthy early care and education program
- A subset of 123 standards and 9 appendices from Caring for Our Children, 3rd Edition
- Intended Audience



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Caring for Our Children: Environmental Health in Early Care and Education

How were CFOC3 standards chosen?

Question: If the standard is not followed, would the resulting harm be considered the result of:

a) an environmental health incident (e.g. a chemical or allergen exposure, noise level);

b) a physical injury (e.g., a fall); or c) an infectious agent (bacteria, virus)?

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Caring for Our Children: Environmental Health in Early Care and Education

How was the collection developed?

- Created initial list of CFOC3 standards and Introduction in partnership with CEHN;
- Contacted CFOC3 EH Technical Panel Chair and NRC Steering Committee for initial review of standards chosen;
- Determined stakeholder reviewers and requested feedback;

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
How was the collection developed?

- Reviewed and approved by CFOC3 Steering Committee;
- Posted document to NRC Website at end of July; and
- Marketed via social media, E-Resources and "What's New" for August on the NRC website.

- Utilized expertise of Eco-Healthy Child Care® and CEHN staff;

- Explored future collaboration opportunities.


