BACKGROUND

- Approximately 48% of U.S. 17-year olds and 71% of 19-year olds have had sex (Finer,2013)
- Federally funded abstinence-only sex ed programs cannot educate adolescents about contraceptives or safe sex practices (Santelli, 2006)
- Older studies found that adolescents with frequent church attendance had lower rates of modern methods of contraception use (Studer & Thornton, 1987, Durant & Sanders, 1989)
- Some studies find fewer sexual partners and more consistent birth control use in religious teens (Miller & Gur, 2002, Wallace & Forman, 1998)

BACKGROUND

- Support for abstinence only programs is often motivated by religious beliefs (Santelli, 2006)
- Religious beliefs influence parent communication to teens about sex (Regnerus, 2005)
- Parent-child communication can influence teen knowledge, attitudes, and behaviors related to sex (Sommers & Paulson, 2000)
- Religious beliefs influence teen sexual behaviors (Sinha, Cnaan, Gelles, 2007)

RESEARCH QUESTIONS

Among 15-24 year olds who engage in premarital sex, is there an association between religious affiliation and the type of birth control used during first sexual intercourse, after adjusting for confounders?

- Does frequency of religious service attendance mediate the association between religious affiliation and the use of modern methods of birth control (i.e. birth control methods other than withdrawal or rhythm) during first sexual intercourse?
- Does parent-child communication about sex mediate the association between religious affiliation and the use of modern methods of birth control during first sexual intercourse?
- Does formal sex education mediate the association between religious affiliation and the use of modern methods of birth control during first sexual intercourse?

Control Variables:

Age
Race/ethnicity
Parent education

Potential Mediating Variables

- Frequency of religious service attendance
- Parent-child communication about safe sex
- Formal sex education about safe sex

Primary Independent Variable:

Religious Affiliation (categorical)
–None (Reference)
–Protestant
–Catholic
–Other

Outcome Variable:

Type of birth control method used during 1st sexual intercourse (categorical)
–None or Traditional method (rhythm and/or withdrawal with no other precautions)
–Modern method of birth control (MMBC), (e.g., use of condom, birth control pill, etc.)

NATIONAL SURVEY OF FAMILY GROWTH

- National survey data collected 2006-2010
- Sampling units based on census blocks
- Computer-assisted in-person interviews
- Oversampled teens and minorities

METHODS: ANALYSIS

- Logistic Regression
- Stratified by gender
- Sample inclusion criteria:
 - reported had sex
 - first sex was not with spouse
 - Between ages 15-24
 - Not missing data on any of study variables
- Weighted with NSFG provided WQ16 variable
- Stata 11

LOGISTIC REGRESSION MODELS

- Model 1: Religion, controls & MMBC use at first intercourse – Focal Relationship
- Model 2: Religion, controls, sex education & MMBC use at first intercourse – Mediator
- Model 3: Religion, controls, parent conversations & MMBC use at first intercourse – Mediator
- Model 4: Religion, controls, religious service attendance at age 14 & MMBC use at first intercourse – Mediator
- Model 5: Religion, controls, all mediators, & MMBC use at first intercourse – Full Model

DEMOGRAPHICS SUMMARY

- Similar for males & females
- Approximately 50% White, 25% Black, and 25% Hispanic
- Parent education varied, most parents completed HS or higher

- Similar for both genders
- Similar rates of sex education across religious groups
- Once/week or more most common rate of attendance for religious respondents

SUMMARY

- Sex ed and parent conversations positively associated with MMBC use at 1st intercourse for both males & females
- Religious service attendance not significant for males or females
- Catholic affiliation is positively associated with MMBC use at first intercourse for males
- This association appears to be mediated by parent-child communication



LIMITATIONS

- NSFG Variables
 - Religion
 - Sex education
- Recall bias for older participants

DISCUSSION

- Study confirmed the relationship of sex education and parent-child conversations to birth control use
- Parental messages about sexual health differ for male and female teens (Diiorio, Pluhar, Belcher, 2003)
- Evangelical religious gender role expectations for romantic relationships (Freitas, 2008)

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INDEPENDENT & DEPENDENT VARIABLES

- Independent: Religion raised
- Dependent: Use of a modern method of birth control at first intercourse

“Looking at Card 45b, that first time, what methods did you and she use to prevent pregnancy or sexually transmitted disease?”

MEDIATING VARIABLES: SEX EDUCATION

“Now I'm interested in knowing about formal sex education you may have had. (Before you were 18, did / Have) you ever (have / had) any formal instruction at school, church, a community center or some other place about...

- how to say no to sex?*
- methods of birth control?*
- sexually transmitted diseases?*
- how to prevent HIV/AIDS?”*

MEDIATING VARIABLES: PARENT-CHILD COMMUNICATION

“ (Before you were 18 years old, which / Which), if any, of the topics shown on Card 23 (did you ever talk /have you ever talked) with a parent or guardian about?”

- How to say no to sex
- Methods of birth control
- Where to get birth control
- Sexually transmitted diseases
- How to prevent HIV/AIDS
- How to use a condom

MEDIATING VARIABLES: RELIGIOUS SERVICE ATTENDANCE AT AGE 14

When you were 14, about how often did you usually attend religious services?

More than once a week

Once a week

2-3 times a month

Once a month (about 12 times a year)

3-11 times a year

Once or twice a year

Never
