

Recognizing Attacks on Abortion Care as a Public Health Emergency, Strengthening and Uniting Public Health Voices for Reproductive Justice

November, 2014

The American Public Health Association (APHA) and international human rights covenants recognize individuals' rights to choose whether and when to have children and how many children to have, to have the information and means to do so, to make these decisions free of coercion, discrimination and violence, and to attain the highest standard of reproductive and sexual health.

However, U.S. and state policies since 2010 increasingly obstruct access to sexual and reproductive health care, with a focus on abortion care, coercing women to carry unintended pregnancies to term. New restrictions on funding for abortions from both public and private sources compound the damage of the Hyde Amendment, which prohibits federal funding for abortions in the U.S., including through Medicaid; and the Helms Amendment, which restricts federal funds for abortions internationally.

These policies discriminate against women, and undermine public health, Evidence includes:

- <u>Sharp disparities</u> in unintended pregnancies and births in the U.S. by race/ethnicity, income, and location
- Lower funding for women's and children's health services, and worse population health outcomes, in states where anti-abortion campaigns have prevailed.
- <u>Blocked access to comprehensive reproductive health services internationally</u> due to the Helms Amendment, undermining the ability of countries to adequately address maternal mortality and morbidity
