## Background



- Orange County is located in the Hudson Valley, about 60 miles north of New York City
- Approximately 375,000 residents
- 18 school districts with approx. 60,600 students



## Healthy Orange

- Healthy Orange is the umbrella organization for all of the OCDH chronic disease grant and countyfunded programs
- Developed in 2006, it focuses primarily on:
  - Improving nutrition
  - Promoting a tobacco-free lifestyle
  - Increasing physical activity
- Childhood obesity is now a national priority
  - Few data resources available at the county/district level

### **Survey Development**

- Based on CDC's Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YBRSS)
  - Surveys students in grades 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> in a sample of high schools across U.S. every 2 years
  - Monitors six types of health-risk behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of death and disability among youth
    - **X** Tobacco use
    - **▼** Dietary behaviors
    - **Physical activity**
    - Alcohol and drug use
    - × Sexual behaviors
    - Behaviors leading to unintentional injury and violence
  - Over 80 questions

### **Survey Development**

- Focus on three topics aligned with Healthy Orange priorities
  - Tobacco use
  - Physical activity
  - Dietary behaviors
- Survey piloted in multiple settings
- Created survey in ExpertScan program
  - Creates scannable surveys with individualized codes for each school district
  - One No need for manual data entry!
  - Scanned, automatically entered into database and program tallies results

### **Survey Distribution**

- Created a shorter survey- approx. 30 questions
- Surveys were distributed during one class period
- Collected, analyzed and created reports
- Compiled data by County and School District

### **Survey Results**

- Completed in 11/15 high schools in Orange County
- 10,617 students completed the survey
- Response rate of 65.2% in 11 high schools
- School specific reports were sent to superintendents
- Data helps target Healthy Orange Programs for each participating school district

#### **Survey Results**

- Current tobacco use lower than NYS and national average (10% vs. 16% nationally)
- Fifty percent of students using computers, internet or social media more than 3 hours per day compared to 40% at state and national levels
- Only small percentages of students meeting recommended guidelines for fruit, vegetable or daily breakfast consumption
- Exceed both state and national rates for recommended daily physical activity of 60 minutes/day (40%)

### Limitations of Survey

- Data did not include students who have dropped out of school or students who were absent the day the survey was administered
- Data based on self-report, thus students may underreport illegal type behavior
- Four high schools chose not to participate

#### Follow Up

- Completed focus groups with students and staff from different high schools to help improve the survey and its administration
- Gave individualized and county data presentations:
  - Health and wellness committees
  - School superintendents
  - County Youth Bureau
  - Student groups
- Results shared in local newspaper to engage parents and public

## Successful Strategies

- Use existing validated survey questions to help expedite survey creation
- Use existing partnerships with the schools to garner support from Superintendents
- Identify a champion in each school district interested in the survey to help with logistics
- Share results with parents through school communication

#### **Barriers and Solutions**

- Minimal time for students to complete surveys in the classroom
  - Gave each district flexibility to complete survey in health class, physical education class or outside of core requirements
- Schools being asked to complete multiple surveys
  - Met with local government and community groups to work out timing and combining into one survey every 2 years
- Time constraints to complete survey scan
  - Worked with local students to help with process
  - Consider using online survey during one class period

#### **Future Directions**

- Work with schools to develop collaborative programing to target unhealthy behaviors
- Getting each high school in Orange County to participate in the survey
  - Solicit help from students to engage your parents, community and school officials
- Complete the survey every 2 years to coincide with YRBSS reports to understand trends over time
  - Next survey will be distributed in the Fall of 2015
